## GOSPEL: Jn 1:35-42

As John stood with two of his disciples, Jesus passed, and John stared hard at him and said, 'Look, there is the lamb of God.' Hearing this, the two disciples followed Jesus. Jesus turned round, saw them following and said, 'What do you want?' They answered, 'Rabbi,' - which means Teacher - 'where do you live?' 'Come and see' he replied; so they went and saw where he lived, and stayed with him the rest of that day. It was about the tenth hour. One of these two who became followers of Jesus after hearing what John had said was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. Early next morning, Andrew met his brother and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' – which means the Christ – and he took Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked hard at him and said, You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas' – meaning Rock.

#### Assisted living, rather than assisted dying.

And when death encroaches, we need more help in prioritising quality of life rather than prolonging life by extraordinary medical means. We need better palliative care with the ultimate goal of, not so much a good death, but living a good life to the very end.

I was privileged to attend the Liturgy Conference **"THE LIVING PRESENCE OF CHRIST"** at St. Andrew's College Marayong on 04 November 2017. The Keynote Speaker was Rev Fr. Peter Williams, VG VE. Fr. Peter spoke about the book **WHAT WE HAVE DONE AND WHAT WE HAVE FAILED TO DO** by Kevin Irwin that deals with the implementing and praying of the liturgy as reformed after the second Vatican Council.

#### WORKSHOP 1 : MAKING CHRIST PRESENT THROUGH A CULTURE OF HOSPITALITY

#### WORKSHOP TWO : PROCLAIMING THE WORD - THE PRESENCE OF CHRIST IN THE WORD

Deacon George spoke about some strategies we should use when proclaiming the Word of God. We are not news readers. We are the voice of God talking to His people through his Word. We need to speak clearly, loudly and with conviction. We should read and understand the passage. Allow the Holy Spirit to guide us. Accept criticism and consider how you can improve your preparation.

#### WORKSHOP THREE : SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION – A FIELD PERSPECTIVE

Our sessions are times for sharing our faith and deepening our relationship with Jesus. Facilitating faith sharing is a ministry of service to the group that assists members to become more aware of their personal and communal experience of God in their lives. It's not about coming to Mass, but working towards our relationship with God.
