FR PAUL MARSHALL OF GREYSTANES REFLECTS ON CHANGE

From last weekend's OLQP Greystanes bulletin

I have had an extra cavalcade of parties this December celebrating my 60th birthday. It's been a great time and also time to look back over a 'road less travelled.' At 30, I was ordained a Deacon; at 40 I was in my first parish as a Parish Priest (Luddenham-Warragamba); at 50 I was PP at Toongabbie; and now 60 at Greystanes.

We, at OLQP, have been blessed to have three priests over the past 18 months. But that was the exception, not the norm. In my first parish at Luddenham-Warragamba, I had a 300sq. km area (part of which is soon to become Badgery's Creek airport) and four churches to look after. For seven years I was the only priest there. When I was appointed to Toongabbie in 2007, it went from two priests to one. My first decision was to cut the number of Masses. Some people left the parish because of that decision. To carry a parish as a PP is a magnificent service to God and the faith community. The reality is also that you need to be Manager, Liturgical Leader, Pastoral Carer, Human Resources Co-ordinator, Pastoral Planner, Financially responsible; the Work, Health and Safety Officer, Maintainer of Professional Standards; visit the elderly and the sick and care for the youth group, Sacramental presence, school chaplain, and know the codes for alarms and where you turn the water gas and electricity off if you need to. And then there is the unexpected hospital call-out or death.

We need to work together in mutuality - clergy and people. (As clergy we need to be more accountable to the parish faith community). As parents, many of you are realising that faith cannot be simply "caught" or "handed on" in families. The Catholic culture of families and parish no longer is the sole way of handing on faith. We are witnessing the changing face of families; the changing face of the priesthood; and the changing face of the Church.

Parishes like Greystanes and Blacktown are mega-parishes. We need a core of 2 or 3 ordained ministers to sustain the present sacramental and preaching ministry of a parish like Greystanes.




PARISH OFFICE OPENING HOURS
