UNCONDITIONAL LOVE

While we celebrate this 6th Sunday in this Year of Mark, we can also be aware that, if it was not a Sunday, we would be celebrating the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes on this 11th of February. These are the days throughout the Catholic world when we focus particularly on the sick and house-bound and our ministry with them.

Providentially this weekend we meet a person living with leprosy, something that is outside the experience of most Australians. My own experience here is very limited. I have met only a few, often sitting begging in the streets of Uganda, East Africa. Hands minus fingers, feet minus toes and isolated for fear of contamination in a world without Centrelink. They are the poorest of the poor in their communities.

Even today, as in the times of Jesus, there are restrictions around relating to those with this highly contagious leprosy, in order to protect the health of the community. While the Church remembers extraordinary personalities like Damian of Malaki who lived with lepers and so died as one, there are many nurses who have shown such unconditional love in caring those with infectious diseases like diphtheria and tuberculosis only to become infected themselves.

While Jesus cures the leper he meets today, he himself becomes a "leper" - no longer able to go openly into a town but had to stay outside where no one lived. Jesus assumes the social position of the leper by virtue of this healing. Such unconditional love!

At this time of the year when we remember the sick, let us also honour the nursing profession and those whose lives have been affected by the unconditional love they have shown in their care. While nurses are notorious for the back pains from lifting patients, there are others who have given their own lives in caring for those with infectious diseases like diphtheria and tuberculosis. Those who risk their own health in caring for others witness to the unconditional love we meet in Jesus who cures the leper.

Be my protector, O God, a mighty stronghold to save me. For you are my rock, my stronghold! Lead me, guide me, for the sake of your name.

FIRST READING: LV 13:1-2. 44-46

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 31:1-2. 5. 11. R. **V.7**

I turn to you, Lord, in time of trouble, and you fill me with the joy of salvation.

SECOND READING: 1 COR 10:31 – 11:1

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Alleluia, alleluia! A great prophet has appeared among us; God has visited his people. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Jn 1:35-42

A leper came to Jesus and pleaded on his knees: 'If you want to' he said 'you can cure me.' Feeling sorry for him, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him. 'Of course I want to!' he said. 'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON:

They ate and had their fill, and what they craved the Lord gave them; they were not disappointed in what they craved.


This represents a wonderful opportunity to involve younger people in the leadership of the parish.
