THE TIME HAS COME!

The language used for the writing of the original texts of the New Testament was Greek, a language which had two words for time: chronos and kairos. The former referred to the day, hour and minute, while the latter spoke of a time of new possibility.

It was here in Blacktown's Bowman Hall in 1972, where the soon to be Prime Minister, Gough Whitlam announced his campaign theme, It's Time. His proclamation was kairos rather than chronos! Nearly fifty years later, social historians argue that period was a turning point in Australian life and culture.

Our Church is very much in a kairos time at the moment. Some would say our Church is in a make or break time. Recent years and the scandal of sexual abuse have placed us in the desert where we have seen more wild beast than angels. The gospel today calls us to the desert, that place of silence and healing. Here, there is a time of new possibility.

Some three or more years ago a friend, who is a respected academic said that beyond the sexual abuse scandal and there was another challenge on the horizon that would shake our church. As the issue of financial transparency for the Church has appeared in the media in the past week, I have been reminded of his words.

The editorial of the Sydney Morning Herald, ironically on Ash Wednesday wrote: The Church has a spiritual mission and must be allowed to continue that work. But insofar as it moves into secular activities, in schools, hospitals, aged care homes, youth organisations, charities and anything else, it must be subject to all secular rules, including taxation.

As our society calls us to honour the recommendations of the Royal Commission, there are new voices calling for greater financial transparency in our Church. The days of clerical and ecclesial privilege and exemption from taxation may well be coming to an end. Our Church will be a poorer church – perhaps the tragedy is that we have not chosen it!

The shadow side of all of this is that we are living in no ordinary time, no chronos time. This is a kairos moment which will reshape our church. The time has come!
