As we approach the end of the Church's year it is time to look back in appreciation and thanksgiving, to take time to say, WELL DONE!

In the last year or two I have been asking the question of those in ministry, who will be exercising your ministry in 2025? Many have come forward and undertaken courses of formation for ministry. Ministries have been coordinated to foster further growth and to help us to welcome, grow and act.

Every parent knows that to have growth you have to step back and trust your children, even allowing them to make mistakes. I often say that if you want someone to learn how to cook, you have to get out of the kitchen! We have to stand back and trust others if there is to be growth. The same is true in growing people in ministry. We need to be able to say, I WILL TRUST YOU!

Today Matthew speaks to us of talents. We may well have a talent or gift that has been fine-tuned over the years in one particular ministry. Perhaps we feel that no one can do my ministry as well as I can. There is risk in standing back and allowing the multiplication of gifts and growing our talents for the good of the Church and it's mission.

The multiplication of gifts might simply involve *tapping people on the shoulder* and inviting them into ministry. Down the track in can be a question of mentoring those who are new in ministry. Those who know that they are appreciated in small things will grow to do greater things.

So to the some three hundred parishioners who are in active ministry, it is time to say WELL DONE. We give thanks for the multiplication of ministries that is happening among us and thanks the Lord for the grace of growth as we welcome, grow and act.

YEAR OF MATTHEW - YEAR A Thirty Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:

The Lord said: I think thoughts of peace and not of affliction. You will call upon me, and I will answer you, and I will lead back your captives from every place.

FIRST READING: PRV 31:10-13. 19-20. 30-31

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 127:1-5. R. V.1 Happy are those who fear the Lord.

SECOND READING: 1 THES 5:1-6

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Alleluia, alleluia! Live in me and let me live in you, says the Lord; my branches bear much fruit. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Mt 25:14-30

Jesus spoke this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a man on his way abroad who summoned his servants and entrusted his property to them. To one he gave five talents, to another two, to a third one; each in proportion to his ability. Then he set out. The man who had received the five talents promptly went and traded with them and made five more. The man who had received two made two more in the same way. But the man who had received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money. Now a long time after, the master of those servants came back and went through his accounts with them. The man who had received the five talents came forward bringing five more. "Sir", he said "you entrusted me with five talents; here are five more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Next the man with the two talents came forward. "Sir," he said "you entrusted me with two talents; here are two more that I have made." His master said to him, Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Last came forward the man who had the one talent. "Sir," said he "I had heard you were a hard man, reaping where you have not sown and gathering where you have not scattered; so I was afraid, and I went off and hid your talent in the ground. Here it is; it was yours, you have it back." But his master answered him, "You wicked and lazy servant! So you knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I have not scattered? Well then, you should have deposited my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have recovered my capital with interest. So now, take the talent from him and give it to the man who has the five talents. For to everyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from the man who has not, even what he has will be taken away. As for this good-for-nothing servant, throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth.""




