### THE SMALLEST OF ALL GROW INTO THE BIGGEST

Michael Ramsay, a keen gardener, was elected Archbishop of Canterbury in 1961, just the year before St John XXIII surprised the Catholic community by calling the Second Vatican Council. As head of the Anglican Church, Michael Ramsay had had a strong interest in ecumenism and fostering relations across the Churches. In 1966 he went to Rome and met Blessed Paul VI. It was the first such meeting of the heads of the Anglican and Catholic community since the Reformation, some four hundred years earlier. There developed a rich friendship between the two leaders and a serious dialogue that looked towards unity.

As the second Vatican Council continued, there was considerable attention given to the dialogue with the ancient Orthodox Churches, as well as the Anglican and Protestant Churches. A commission on Anglican/Catholic dialogue continued for some years, albeit losing some of its first fervour. When hope of deeper unity seemed to fade and a certain despair set in, Michael Ramsay assured people with the words; the most important things happen in a garden in winter!

As autumn sheds its mantle of colour, composting the earth below, seeds rest awaiting the warmth of a spring sun. We know that the smallest of seeds can thrust upwards to become the richest of plants. New seeds planted, even in the bleakest of times can bear fruit.

In recent years I have asked, some would say too often, who will be exercising your ministry in 2020 and 2025? We have seen many seeds of ministry, much growth and now some three hundred people in parish ministries. In recent weeks we have seen the "Say Yes" campaign to grow ministries further. Can you tap someone on the shoulder and say have you thought of....? If not you might say to the leadership team, I think so and so would be good in this particular ministry! Some might call that dobbing people in, something that is seen as very un-Australian. I prefer to see it as engaging in discernment of one another's gifts.

For those in ministries there is the "Growing in Ministry" reflection opportunities to share our experiences in ministry. Details are on page 2 of bulletin. Winter may well be a good image for our Post-Royal Commission Church but we know too that the most important things happen in a garden in winter and THE SMALLEST OF ALL GROW INTO THE BIGGEST. -Fr Peter

### **GOSPEL: Mk 4:26-34**

Jesus said to the crowds, 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time; he starts to reap because the harvest has come.' He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'


### **THEMES OF FAITH** A guided exploration of key components of Catholic life
