I WILL BE WITH YOU!

Even if you didn't watch the wedding of Meagan and Harry last weekend - and I must confess that as staunch republican, I did - you could hardly have missed the discussion that has continued during the past week. So many of the comments has been about the dynamic sermon. Last Sunday morning Deacon George said he was rather nervous about preaching after the sermon he had heard the night before at the royal wedding!

Bishop Michael Curry is an Afro-American preacher, his words which would normally be calling for the amen of the congregation, left the stiff upper lip of the largely English congregation bemused. This wide-ranging sermon spoke of slavery and freedom, of the protestant pastor, martyr and social activist Martin Luther King and the mysticism of French Jesuit Pierre Teilhard de Chardin. However, the resonating antiphon of his preaching was God is love and love is power.

Today's feast of the Trinity takes us to the very heart of the inner life of God, reminding us that God is love: the love of the three persons in community. The feast also reminds us that we who have been baptised into the life of the Trinity are called to relationship. In the end, most of life is about relationship! Our families and communities of faith are called to reflect, albeit dimly, the inner life of God. Thus the God of love empowers us, for love is power.

The Gospel this weekend assures us that I am with you. As we begin the journey towards the Plenary Council of 2020 and as we face this time of transition in the leadership, it is important to affirm our faith in the presence of the Lord in the changes that are ahead for our parish and for the Catholic community across this land. There is increasing strength in our parish ministry groups and their leaderships. Increasingly our Australian Church will be lay-led, as it was in its foundation in colonial times.

So as we prepare to make this new journey as Blacktown Catholics and Australian Catholics, we need to hear anew the Lord's promise I WILL BE WITH YOU.

Parish Photography & Filming Policy

At Parish Events we are often taking photos of our parish community to share on social media about how at MQOF we can welcome, grow and act. We have four guidelines to keep children and the wider community safe, as well as ensure respectful practices concerning the use of social media:

- **1) Seek permission** from Parish Priest or parish staff to photograph or record their activities within the parish.
- 2) Respect requests from others if they do no wish their photo or photos of their children to be circulated. If you see people taking photos of you and would not like these to appear on social media, please inform the person who is taking the photo.
- 3) Don't tag or include identifying information on social media without their permission or the permission of their parent/carer.
- 4) **Crop** photos of other children or seek permission from their parent/carer before posting online.
