Sunday, 26 Aug 2018: Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B

To stay with Jesus or to walk away from Jesus - What's your choice?

To stay with Jesus or to walk away? That's the confronting choice I'm faced with in today's Gospel. I'm astounded that some of Jesus' followers walked away because they found his teaching intolerable. Surely I would not walk away: But then I think of the core of Jesus' teaching, love God and love one another. My love of God is manifested, not in the hours I devote to prayer but in my love of the other, because in loving the other I am honouring Christ in the other. We are all made in the image of God that is a fundamental fact of our belief.

As I ponder my treatment of the others in my life I'm drawn to Pope Francis' letter on child abuse. The Pope paints an evocative image of Mary standing at the foot of her Son's cross. Pope Francis writes; 'Mary the first of the disciples, teaches all of us as disciples how we are to halt before the suffering of the innocent, without excuses or cowardice.' I ponder Mary cradling the lifeless body of her Son. As I reflect on this scene; I asked myself: Whose body is Mary holding a victim of sexual abuse or some helpless refuge? After all they all carry the innocents of Christ.

Last week I watched an interview with the surgeon Munjed Al Muderis. Al Muderis fled Iraq after witnessing the execution of his boss for refusing to mutilate the ears of deserters from Saddam Hussein's army. Al Muderis escaped a similar fate by hiding in a storeroom for hours; however he was a wanted man. He escaped from Iraq reaching Christmas Island by boat where he was detained and sent to a detention centre. He spoke of the compassion of a custom's official who allowed him to call his mother in Iraq by satellite phone; he also spoke chillingly of having his number marked on his bare shoulder with permanent ink on his arrival at the detention centre. From that moment on he was a number not a person. As a result of Dr Al Muderis' work Australia now leads the world in prosthetic implants.

I reflect on the cost of "Keeping our borders safe" in both lost opportunity and human misery. Have I the courage to walk with Jesus and confront the abuse of the innocent "other" in our society or will I walk away? My choice.
