Sunday, 14 Oct 2018: Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B

We remember Mary - the Mother of Jesus.

It is hard to put into words all the reasons behind my deep admiration and love for Mary the mother of Jesus, but I shall persevere to do my best. There are many scripture references that shine a light on Mary's wonderful qualities. I have chosen just a few.

Mary, who was born during a period bound by rigid rules and observances, was holy and devoted to God. She was also brave and courageous. She possessed an admirable combination of qualities for one so young, living in those times. When the angel appeared and told her that she would be the mother of God, Mary knew not what the future held, but she said 'Yes' in complete surrender to God's will (Luke 1:26-38). When the shepherds visited the newborn Jesus, it says, 'Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart' (Luke 2:19). Mary also took time for moments of stillness and reflection.

Mary's love for family shines through when she makes haste to meet and stay a while with her cousin Elizabeth. She made sure she was present to share the joy in her cousin's life. The Magnificat or Mary's song of praise reflects her love for God, and raises our souls in worship. One can see that Mary has a good sense of self, along with gratitude when she exclaims, 'Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed' (Luke 1:48). She is able to accept the goodness that God has shown her and further proclaim it to all.

Mary's compassion and humility are hard to ignore. During the wedding at Cana she instructs the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you' (John 2:5). She not only accepted Gods plan, but also continued to follow through with utmost devotion. She graciously directed people to her son.

As we continue going through the scriptures we read how Mary stood by her son as he was put to death on the cross. Both Mary and the disciples were in grave danger too. Things could have taken a turn, leading to serious consequences but nothing deterred her from staying by Jesus' side. Mary stood quietly and in solidarity with her son in his mission. Her inner strength was remarkable.

Finally, Mary had a great sense of discipleship and community. Even after the Ascension of Jesus she stayed with the disciples and continued to help and support them. At Pentecost, Mary was in the upper room with them (Acts 1:13-15). We do not give this much thought but as a woman, she was very much a part of the first church. She proves to be a woman of witness and action.

While humanity searches restlessly for direction and worldly role models, we need not look too far. Mary shows us the way to Jesus through her exemplary life. She did not have to be born in the 20th century to be a woman who stood up for what she believed in. Mary understood the balance between faith and courage centuries ago! -Christina Rodricks

YEAR OF MARK - YEAR B 28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON:

If you, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But with you is found forgiveness, O God of Israel.

FIRST READING: WIS 7:7-11

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 89:12-17. R. V.14 Fill us with your love, O Lord, and we will sing for joy!

SECOND READING: HEB 4:12-13

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Alleluia, alleluia! Happy the poor in spirit; the kingdom of heaven is theirs! Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Mk 10:17-30

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.

Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them, 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another, 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said, 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.'

Peter took this up. 'What about us?' he asked him. 'We have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and land – not without persecutions – now in this present time and, in the world to come, eternal life.'

MASS OFFERINGS


