#### COURAGE...GET UP!

While I have long been a staunch republican, I can't help but admire Prince Harry and his wife Meagan. Their seeming drought-breaking visit saw a rain drenched Harry speaking at Dubbo of the courage of rural Australians. So many current issues were conflated in that speech: courage in rural communities, courage among participants of the Invictus Games and the courage of those who seek help for mental health issues. Gone was the traditional English stiff upper lip as Harry said it is OK to seek help - "I did!"

Today Mark introduces us to Bartimaeus, the blind beggar. He was an outcast, one to be scolded because by virtue of his blindness he would be seen to be a sinner. Jesus challenged his followers to seek out Bartimaeus and "call him here", a challenge that remains for disciples. He then calls Bartimaeus to have courage ordering him to "get up".

As I sit writing this week, I am in the midst of the Nagle College senior's retreat at Stanwell Tops. One hundred and fifteen young women. One component of the retreat involves working through the Plenary Council process that some parishioners have already shared. It has been a privilege to sit with articulate young women and listen to their responses to the question: "What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time." Their responses are being recorded and reflections will continue with students and staffs in all our schools over coming months.

Last Monday we saw the apology to those people who told with great courage, their story of sexual abuse in institutions across Australia, many of them Church run. With courage they found their voice and left many of us without words. The impact of these events has left its mark on the young Nagle voices I have been listening to and their view of the Church.

Both the Gospel this weekend and the experience of sharing in the early stages of the Plenary Council process, calls me to challenge you to make the best of the opportunities for engaging in the process of the Plenary Council. As the Lord said to Bartimaeus, "COURAGE...GET UP!"

#### GOSPEL: Mk 10:46-52

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.
