MARY TEACHES US

There are a couple of passages in the Gospels where Jesus seems to rebuke his mother, and the Gospel for this Sunday is one example. Unfortunately, many take these passages as an excuse to downplay Marian devotion and to criticise Catholics for praying to her. Yet, when we begin to delve into such passages and their meaning in the context of the rest of Scripture, then we will discover that Jesus is not so unkind to his mother as we might think, nor are we so wrong to offer her love and devotion.

For example, in the Gospel this Sunday Jesus refers to Mary as 'Woman'. We might see this as a rather offensive way to address a woman, particularly if we know her name. Yet, when read in light of Genesis, Jesus' address to Mary can be seen as anything but rude.

In Genesis 3 Eve is constantly referred to as 'woman', and she is also presented as the mother, the chief lady of the covenant between God and man. 'Woman' thus becomes a title for her, a name of honour. Unfortunately, we know that, alongside Adam, Eve sinned and forfeited the honour of that title, tarnishing her name. Yet, God raised up another woman, one who would not sin but would cooperate faithfully with God's plan for our salvation. That woman is Mary. Thus, rather than being an offensive address to a pushy mother, our Lord's use of 'Woman' to refer to Mary takes on a very profound significance. She becomes the new Eve, the new mother, the new chief lady of the new covenant. She, by the grace of God, rights the wrongs, as it were, of Eve, as St. Irenaeus (a bishop of the second century AD) explained:

And thus also it was that the knot of Eve's disobedience was loosed by the obedience of Mary. For what the virgin Eve had bound fast through unbelief, this did the virgin Mary set free through faith. (Against Heresies III.xxii.4).

We should not be afraid, then, to show Mary honour and devotion, for it is precisely what Jesus does in today's Gospel. Indeed, by her instruction to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you', Mary teaches us what it is to be a Christian: to follow Jesus Christ in all we do. And rather than hindering us from doing this, today's Gospel shows that Mary helps us do this.

God has called us with the gospel to share in the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Jn 2:1-11

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' Jesus said, 'Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews; each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water,' and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now' he told them, 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from – only the servants who had drawn the water knew – the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink, but you have kept the best wine till now.'

This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.
