Strength in the Wilderness

The Gospel of the First Sunday of Lent tells us of the journey of Jesus into the desert, the three temptations of the devil and Jesus' responses to his "lies" that we, in one way or another have to face ourselves. During Lent we are all invited to look more deeply into the heart and mind of Jesus and so find strength as we journey into the deserts of our personal lives and our community. We are taught:

"Jesus' temptation reveals the way in which the Son of God is Messiah, contrary to the way Satan proposes to him and the way men wish to attribute to him. This is why Christ vanquished the Tempter for us: 'For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathise with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sinning. 'By the solemn forty days of Lent the Church unites herself each year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert'' (CCC no. 540)

The wilderness/desert presents to us a seeming absence of life and aridity, a place of temptation. But let us be reminded that we can also discover an oasis in it, a refuge where we find life and strength. Jesus shows us that his strength rests on his filial intimacy with the Father, and his weapons are the truth of the Word of God and the power of the Holy Spirit in Him. The Holy Spirit enabled Jesus to understand the truth of the Word of God and likewise enabled him to cling to it. He knew very well that by clinging to the Word of God, he will not be put to shame, he will survive.

Let us also be aware how the devil can manipulate and interpret the Word of God to serve its own purpose. The temptations to power, wealth and prestige described in this Gospel narrative are presented in a very attractive way in such a manner that it would appear logical to the human mind. Why not if it would benefit me and others? Jesus ultimately teaches us that there is more to life: "People do not live on bread alone," "You shall worship the Lord your God and serve him alone", and "You shall not challenge the Lord your God."

We are saved by Jesus Christ not through wealth, power and prestige, not through ambitions and selfpreoccupations but by the humble death he assumed. We are all called to know and encounter Jesus. At Mary, Queen of the Family Parish, we would like to Welcome, Grow and Act in the name of Jesus. I invite you then to discover him and the Holy Spirit more @ ALPHA! Fr Regie

GOSPEL: Lk 4:1-13

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone.' Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says: 'You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone.'

Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God', he said to him 'throw yourself down from here, for scripture says: He will put his angels in charge of you to guard you, and again: They will hold you up on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone.' But Jesus answered him, 'It has been said: You must not put the Lord your God to the test.'

Having exhausted all these ways of tempting him, the devil left him, to return at the appointed time.

Get to Know the Parish Team

Deacon John Cinya

I was born in South Sudan in a town called Nimule just at the border between South Sudan and Uganda. Due to the conflict and war, I escaped to Ethiopia and have lived in the refugee camp for four years. In 1998, the Australian government accepted me to settle in Hobart. I could not bear the cold weather in Hobart; I decided to relocate to Sydney. Since 2002, as the Sudanese refugee continued to settle and the number increases, we decided to form the Sudanese Catholic Community. We started the Sudanese Mass at St Joachim, Lidcombe, then we moved to Our Lady Queen of Peace (OLQP), Greystanes, then to St Anthony, Toongabbie and lastly in 2011 we moved to Mary Queen of the Family, Blacktown. My life always has been on move, but

always I move with Jesus Christ, because I know that my safety and strength comes from Him. Since 2012, I was on my formation to the permanent diaconate. I am so blessed to serve in Mary Queen of the Family at this difficult time. But with hope, Jesus moves us to action in a practical Christian living and challenges us to preach, heal and restore back life through love, joy and hope. We should not fear, but continue with the words of St Paul: *"Therefore, my beloved brothers, be firm, steadfast, always fully devoted to the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labour is not in vain."*
