True and False Compassion

Last week we began to hear from our Lord's famous Sermon on the Mount, and that Gospel finished with the very strong warning: 'Alas for you when the world speaks well of you!' What this tells us is that God's will for us is not meant to be judged by the standards of the world. We are meant to be different, and the Gospel for this week gives us some very practical ways to ensure that. We are told to 'Love our enemies', when the world tells us to get them back; we are told to pray for those who treat us badly, when the world tells us to hit them when they least expect it; we are told not to condemn, and yet we consume articles, social media posts and television shows that make it their business to condemn. The life God is calling us to is not meant to conform to the standard of the world: it is meant to be different.

And this means that when Jesus asks us to be compassionate as our heavenly Father is compassionate, he does not mean the kind of compassion that the world thinks of. It is fashionable now to think of compassion as 'feeling with' someone, as being identical with empathy. So people often say 'I feel your pain' and think that they are thereby being compassionate. That is not what Jesus means. Jesus means the Cross. He showed us there what true compassion is: to suffer with and for someone. Not a suffering that simply feels bad for people, a suffering that is full of an emotional flourish, but a suffering where we concretely go out of our way to die to ourselves for someone else. And his command not to condemn others shows us a perfect way to do this. When someone does something we think is wrong it is so easy to gossip about them, to form very harsh judgements of them in our hearts. True compassion does not do this. True compassion does the really uncomfortable thing and refuses to gossip about them because we are sinners just like them. True compassion is about going out of our way to uphold the justice and dignity that every person deserves as God's creature, as Christ showed us on the Cross. Let us take that Cross as the standard for our life.

2 volunteers needed to register teams on the day. Great way to help if you cannot pick up rubbish


Housing and Energy Assembly

The Bishop's Lenten Appeal will be held this weekend, 23rd/24th February. The Ephpheta Centre, supported by the Parramatta Catholic


