The Glory of the Cross

Today we adore the Holy Cross in a special way. It's being lifted up for us to see with the eyes of our hearts and minds the salvation offered by God to all of us, to the world. We behold the One who is hung on the cross, our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, "the Son of God who loved me and who sacrificed himself for my sake" (Galatians 2:20). "It is love 'to the end' that confers on Christ's sacrifice its value as redemption and reparation, as atonement and satisfaction. He knew and loved us all when he offered his life" (CCC 616).

This is the heart of our Christian faith, Christ died for us and he defeated death, evil and suffering on the cross and in his resurrection. That is why what the world calls foolishness and weakness, Christians call glorious and triumphant (Feast of the Triumph of the Cross- 14 September - Catholic Liturgy). We are all called to see and enter into the depth of the mystery of the cross. St Paul says, "the language of the cross may be illogical to those who are not on the way to salvation, but those of us who are on the way see it as God's power to save... For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom and God's weakness is stronger than human strength" (1 Corinthians 2: 18 -25).

When Jesus told his disciples "to renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me," (Matthew 16:24) he definitely wants us to experience the glory and the triumph by embracing our own crosses. Our own experience of suffering and cross whether physical or moral (anxieties, worries, depression, loneliness etc.) when brought into unity with Jesus can be an opportunity to share in the saving mission of Jesus Christ for all. It would become an occasion to love as Jesus loves, to be transformed by it, to grow and be like Jesus. When our hearts become disposed to this mystery, then we understand the meaning of our suffering and we get away by just "putting up life.

In faith, let us not be afraid to proclaim the glory of the cross. The strength to bear our pain and suffering does not belong to us anymore. It is the strength coming from God. When St Paul pleaded to take out from him the "thorn in the flesh" the Lord said to him, "My grace is enough for you: my power is at its best in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9). May this Good Friday Liturgy brings us healing and transforms our spirits to carry our own crosses for the glory of God! Fr Regie


