## THE GREATEST GIFT

Is Christian love different? Is there something about the love Christians are supposed to have or supposed to display that marks them out from everyone else? In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus clearly teaches so. Jesus says that the love his followers are to display is the love that he first displays: 'love one another as I have loved you'. The pattern of our love, what it looks like, what it involves, what it aims at, is not down to us, not entirely at least. Of course, we choose our friends, we choose our spouses, we choose where to live etc. and in that sense we can determine to some extent whom we must show love to. But wherever we live, whoever our friends are, whoever our spouse is, the manner of our love, the character of Christian love remains the same. That is because we are to love as Christ first loved us: totally, without self-interest. If we are to love as Christ commands us, we cannot choose to love only those we like, or that agree with us; we cannot choose to love only within certain comfortable limits. We must love like Christ did on the Cross. There he died for all: for those that loved him and those that hated him: there he praved for all: for those that followed him in sorrow and for those that drove the nails into him and hurled abuse at him. Jesus loved without self-interest.

Loving like this is unusual, to say the least. It was certainly so in a Roman empire where the poor and widowed and orphaned were not well cared for. That is why people used to say of Christians who cared for them, 'See how they love each other.' It is also unusual in the current socio-political climate where identity politics and the associated culture wars are well underway. In the midst of this, we Christians have a golden opportunity and a fundamental challenge, indeed, a command from Christ: we must be different; we must love another. Despite all the difficulties and misunderstandings and disagreements that we as Christians are bound to have with others because of our beliefs, they should be able to say of us: 'See how they love each other.' Can your family members, your friends, your classmates or work colleagues say this of you? Do we love as Jesus loves us? Fr Jack
