WITNESSES TO CHRIST

The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord reminds us that those who follow Jesus are called to bear witness to his life and mission. He said to his disciples, "You see how it is written that Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this." This is the basic kerygma that believers of Jesus would not hesitate to proclaim to others because they themselves have encountered the Lord and experienced his loving mercy and forgiveness. The Church teaches us: "The disciple of Christ must not only keep the faith and live on it, but also profess it, confidently bear witness to it, and spread it: 'All however must be prepared to confess Christ before men and to follow him along the way of the Cross, amidst the persecutions which the Church never lacks.' Service of and witness

to the faith are necessary for salvation." (CCC no. 1816)

When Jesus asked his disciples to be witnesses of his life and mission before he ascended into heaven, he promised to send them what they truly needed, the Holy Spirit. It's the Holy Spirit- the Helper, the Advocate who will empower them "to make disciples of all nations....and teach them to observe all the commands" he gave them, and assured them of these words "know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time" (Matthew 28:19-20)

Jesus has not left us orphans or abandoned us. The eyes of our faith helps us through the power of the Holy Spirit to encounter him and witness his life and mission to others until this time. It is therefore important to know and learn the words and deeds of Jesus. The "Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you all I have said to you" (John 14:26). We are called thus to be the mouth, the hands, the feet of Jesus to others. Fr Regie



What is canon 517 §1?

Some of you may be aware that the Bishop has not followed the usual arrangement of parish clergy at Mary, Queen of the Family, by not appointing a parish priest. He wrote to Fr. John Paul, Fr. Jack and myself, saying: *'It is the decision of the Bishop of Parramatta that the parish of Blacktown is to be entrusted to two or more priests who will act jointly under the direction of a moderator, in accordance with Canon 517 §1.'*

That canon says:

Can. 517 §1. When circumstances require it, the pastoral care of a parish or of different parishes together can be entrusted to several priests in solidum, with the requirement, however, that in exercising pastoral care one of them must be the moderator, namely, the one who is to direct the joint action and to answer for it to the bishop.

This is different to the normal arrangement of a parish priest with assistants because rather than placing all the responsibility and authority in one priest, the parish priest, he has shared it among all three of us. So while there is no parish priest, the authority and responsibility of a parish priest in terms of the pastoral care and direction of the parish is still present, but simply shared among all three of us. That means that none of us can make a decision relating to the pastoral needs of the parish on our own, we have to work together.

The motivation here is to promote amongst priests, and hopefully overflowing into the rest of the parish, a concrete exercise of community life and prayer, team work, and dialogue.

As the moderator, though, I have the added responsibility of coordinating this shared decision making. It doesn't mean I am the parish priest. It just means that I am to facilitate this teamwork amongst the priests and report to the Bishop on how this, and the parish generally, is going.

Another added responsibility the Bishop has given me as moderator is to take charge of the temporal goods of the parish. That means that I am ultimately responsible for employees, maintenance, finances, and such things. In that sense, I assume the normal responsibilities of a parish priest.

What does this mean for the parish?

Well, because the appointment refers specifically to the priests, there isn't a huge change for the parish in terms of daily activity and decision making. But what it should do is witness to the parish the exercise of community life and prayer, team work, and dialogue, and hopefully set an example for the whole parish to operate in the same way.

But it also means that if you have a concern, question, suggestion etc. relating to the pastoral needs of the parish, feel free to approach any, or indeed all, of the three priests. And if you have a concern about finances or maintenance, then feel free to approach me.

We will gain a better idea of how this works on the ground as time goes by so your patience and prayers is very much appreciated. God bless you all!

MQOF PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL REPORT

At our Meeting on the 16th May 2019 attended by the three priests of the Parish we discussed a variety of matters, but one vital matter which was raised, and should be the focus of all of us, is the journey of the Plenary Council in 2019. This diocese made 17,457 submissions representing 222,000 individuals. The next stage is for working groups to develop Council papers for discussion at the first session of the Council. Nominations for lay delegates of the Plenary Council 2020 will take place in September this year. By April next year, the draft Plenary Council papers will become available for download and discussion. All Catholics in the country are invited and encouraged to express their views on how they see the Church at the present time and what suggestions for change they would like to see implemented. The first session of the Council will take place in Adelaide from 4 -11 October 2020 and the second in Sydney in May 2021. There will be a timetable printed in the bulletin. 
pastoralplanning@parracatholic.org. Other matters discussed included the ALPHA programme, the
