AT HOME WITH GOD

One of the moving and famous scenes in the movie, The Wizard of Oz, is when Dorothy was going home and she had to say "There's no place like home". We have certainly heard this expression or used this expression ourselves. I have personally used this expression before in one of my Facebook posts when I went home. This is true that there is no place like home. It is because 'home' means more than just a house or a building; it is where the people whom you love and who love you are found.

In our Gospel Reading on this 6th Sunday of Easter, Jesus tells us: "If anyone loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him and make our home with him." An Australian Biblical scholar, Fr Brendan Byrne SJ, has given a good commentary on this text: "Believers who truly love Jesus have his assurance that he and the Father have made their 'home' within them. This is perhaps the most beautiful and most intimate expression of the theme of divine indwelling in the Fourth Gospel. The divine 'community' of mutual love constituted by Father and Son sets up house, so to speak – makes itself 'at home' – within the hearts of believers and within the community as a whole. It is not just that believers should come to be at home with God; God wants to be at home with them."

What a remarkable and powerful image that God wants to be at home with us. This notion of being at home with us starts with His love for us. In return, Jesus challenges us that if we really love him, we have to keep his word. We must be a home for God by our words and deeds which are guided by his new commandment of loving one another the way he loves us. We must share His love and proclaim the Good News to all so that others too can create a home for God. Fr John Paul



And my word is not my own: it is the word of the one who sent me. I have said these things to you while still with you; but the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you. Peace I bequeath to you, my own peace I give you, a peace the world cannot give, this is my gift to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. You heard me say: I am going away, and shall return. If you loved me you would have been glad to know that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. I have told you this now before it happens, so that when it does happen you may believe.'

If you love me, keep my commandments, says the Lord, and I will ask the Father and he will send you another Paraclete, to abide with you for ever, alleluia.




