#### THE ESSENTIAL THINGS IN LIFE

Let us explore this seemingly pessimistic author of the Book of Ecclesiastes known to be Ooheleth. His work belongs to Wisdom Literature. In this Sunday's 1st reading, Qoheleth is talking about vanities. We encounter this word ordinarily, much more in the product ads promoting the "value" of vanity. We see them on TV commercials. This becomes so common that we tend to ignore or take for granted what it really means to our life.

I propose that we go back to the roots of the word vanity. Its Latin equivalent is "vanitas" which means emptiness or "vanus" meaning empty. There seems to be a prevailing atmosphere of weariness and emptiness in the tone of Qoheleth's writing. He feels that everything that happens in this world is all vanity. While there may be a grain of truth with what he experienced, he should not be taken literally. The world's goods are still good and are meant to give enjoyment to human beings. These are gifts we receive from God!

But what makes them vain? I believe Qoheleth was trying to find meaning in life, and at the end he could not find it in wealth, pleasures, and even the grief and sorrows of human life. I surmise that ultimately what makes us empty and meaningless is when we allow these goods to become end in themselves, and they control us so we become slaves to them. Unfortunately, when this happens to us, we grow in our pride, greed and selfishness. Reflect the parable of Jesus in our Gospel reading this Sunday (Luke 12:13-21)!

St. Paul exhorts the Colossians in his letter, "Seek what is above... Think of what is above, not of what is on earth" (Col 3,1-5.9-11). This points us to the truths of higher values or transcendental realities. These are realities that we could not encounter by our five senses alone but with a spiritual sense formed by our faith in Christ. These are our experiences of truly loving and being truly loved, of the strength of hope born of our faith in God, in the works and mission of Jesus we share to others like sharing to the Church our time and resources. We may have taken for granted already these things.

It was once told in the famous book "The Little Prince" by Antoine de Saint-Exupéry, that what is most essential in life is invisible to the eyes. There is, thus, the existence of spiritual things that will truly give meaning and deeper satisfaction in human life. Meaning sustains joy within and makes us endure even in the most trying times of our life. We need to ask ourselves every now and then, "What is the meaning of my life?" "What is happening and what is going on

with my life?" "What's the true purpose of all these that keeps me busy and preoccupies me?" Hopefully, we start to seek the counsel of the best person who could ever teach us. The disciples call him master, our Lord Jesus Christ who is truly a human person, while truly divine. He said, "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life." Let us also find one spiritual person who can accompany us in our spiritual journey whenever warranted. But most of all let us pray to the Lord that we may grow in our faith in Him so that we may be sustained by the joy and happiness that the world could not give but He alone. Fr Regie



#### **MQOF PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL REPORT** Highlights of the Parish Council meeting on the 18<sup>TH</sup> July 2019

Richard McMahon, the Director of Pastoral Planning of the Diocese of Parramatta, has agreed to be the moderator for the discernment day for the PPC elections on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> August 2019 in the Multi Purpose Room commencing at 10.00am for 10.30am. Lunch will be provided for nominees. Please lodge the nomination forms at the parish office <u>before</u> 4<sup>th</sup> August 2019.

Paul Scott attended the Parramatta Diocesan Forum. There were 250 attendees. Bishop Vincent Long called the forum to discuss and relate to the Plenary Council 2020. The theme was: 'Go Out into the Deep: Becoming the Community Christ Calls Us to Be'. Bishop Vincent talked about a church that needs to change, needs to move from being inward looking organisation to an outgoing organisation, to relate to the people on the fringe. Another Council member Kristy Scott presented a video on the same theme and feminine spirituality.

### Help stop attempts to make abortion legal up until birth in NSW

Dear Parishioners, Earlier this week, the *Reproductive Health Care Reform Bill 2019* (**Bill**) was tabled in NSW Parliament.

If passed, it will make abortion legal up until birth in NSW, for any reason, as long as two doctors agree if the baby is more than 22 weeks' old.

There has been no community consultation on this Bill. Attempts to rush the Bill through Parliament intentionally exclude the voices of all concerned citizens, including people of faith, from the debate.

### We must act immediately to try and stop this Bill.

Simply phone the electorate office during business hours and let them know that you are from the local area, and would like to ask the Member to vote against the abortion bill. Some reasons you can provide for asking them to vote against the Bill include: It would allow abortion up until birth with the approval of two doctors, for any reason.

- It does nothing to provide alternatives for women who feel distressed at being pregnant and feel they have 'no other option.'
- It provides no protection for women experiencing violence (According to the Australian Bureau of Statistics, 48 per cent of women who report violence from a former partner were abused during pregnancy, as are 18 per cent of women who report violence from a current partner.)
- It overrides conscience of doctors and other medical professionals or institutions, requiring them to disclose their objection and refer to another doctor or institution who will perform the abortion.
- It will leave unborn children and distressed pregnant women even more at risk.
- There has been no community consultation on the Bill.

Voters have been denied the opportunity to have their voices heard in this debate.

Catholics believe that women and babies deserve better than abortion.

If you know a woman experiencing difficulty because of an unexpected pregnancy, please know that there is help available. The Church, through its many agencies, can provide support to women who feel they have no choice available to them other than abortion. **Thank you for your willingness to help in building a culture of life in NSW!**
