#### **Standard Operating Procedures for the liturgy**

As was announced last weekend in the parish notices, there has recently been a review of the parish's Standard Operating Procedures for the liturgy. This review was opened to the whole parish to make submissions in the middle of the year via an announcement at Mass. Once submissions were received, the parish team, in conjunction with the liturgy committee, undertook a review of these Procedures. The up-dated Procedures will take effect from 6<sup>th</sup> December 2019 at the Ministry Mass.

Over the next few weeks, parishioners will find those changes that are most visible and that impact the whole congregation explained in the bulletin and elsewhere.

The first change that parishioners will notice is that from 6<sup>th</sup> December, the welcome slides before Mass will be much reduced. There are several reasons for this. One reason is that it brings our parish into line with the current Guidelines for the Use of Visual Display Systems in Liturgical Celebrations, which indicate that any welcome slides should be brief, consisting of perhaps, 'an image', and that 'Slideshows of images are to be avoided during liturgical celebrations'.

Parishioners will also notice that there will no longer be an Acknowledgement of Country at every Sunday Mass. The parish team sought advice on this practice from the Australian Catholic Bishop's Conference Commission for Relations with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples and related that advice to the liturgy committee, who were in agreement with the proposed change. This Commission advised that it is not necessary to Acknowledge Country at every Sunday Mass, and that a permanent feature in the church or in the bulletin would be quite acceptable, as is the practice in the Archdiocese of Melbourne. This is something we already do in our own bulletin. Rather than attempting to exclude anyone this change reflects the desire of the Church to welcome everyone by not singling out any particular group among us, particularly at the Mass where we are to reflect in our prayer the words of St. Paul: 'There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus.' Galatian 3:28.

# TO STATE OF THE ST

#### AUSTRALIAN CATHOLIC BISHOPS CONFERENCE

The Catholic Church in Australia is dedicating the month of November as a time to pray for those affected by crippling drought conditions and to pray for the gift of rain.

Parishes, schools, families and other Catholic communities across the country are being encouraged to participate in the National Prayer Campaign for Drought, which also invites people to provide assistance to those most in need.

The Bureau of Meteorology says that, on some measures, the current drought is the worst in 100 years or more, with most parts of Australia's eastern states declared to be in drought.

Bishop Columba Macbeth-Green OSPPE from Wilcannia-Forbes oversees a diocese that covers about half of New South Wales, including some of the most drought-affected areas in the country.

He said the month of prayer is an additional response to the local work being done in affected communities. "Some of our Catholic ministries, along with other faith-based, charitable and government organisations, are doing remarkable work, supporting people with material needs, offering financial support and responding to people's psychological and spiritual needs," Bishop Columba said.

"In some dioceses, practical responses like school fee relief or support with rising utility bills can ease an increasing burden for families.

"But in a Catholic context, prayer must be a part of our response."

Bishop Columba said the Bible, in both the Old and New Testaments, has stories of rain being "God's gift" to people who are suffering,

"In times of drought like we are experiencing now, we should pray for God's gift of rain, which will have the power to quench our arid lands and also lift many people's fallen spirits," he said.

Bishop Columba said the National Prayer Campaign must be truly national, noting that the whole country suffers when there is a drought – especially one of this magnitude. The Church needs to be an example of recognising that reality.

"That people living where there is plentiful, or at least enough, water don't seem aware of how much suffering the drought is causing only adds to the hardship of those in drought-affected communities," he said. "The Church across Australia – lay people, religious, priests and bishops alike – needs to stand in solidarity with those suffering most acutely, offering prayers and practical support to those in most need." 


