#### **Strength in the Wilderness**

The Gospel of the First Sunday of Lent tells us of the journey of Jesus into the desert, the three temptations of the devil and Jesus' responses to his "lies" that we, in one way or another have to face ourselves. During Lent we are all invited to look more deeply into the heart and mind of Jesus and so find strength as we journey into the deserts of our personal lives and our community. We are taught:

"Jesus' temptation reveals the way in which the Son of God is Messiah, contrary to the way Satan proposes to him and the way men wish to attribute to him. This is why Christ vanquished the Tempter for us: 'For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathise with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sinning.' By the solemn forty days of Lent the Church unites herself each year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert" (CCC no. 540)

The wilderness/desert presents to us a seeming absence of life, and aridity, a place of temptation. But let us be reminded that we can also discover an oasis in it, a refuge where we find life and strength. Jesus shows us that his strength rests on his filial intimacy with the Father, and his weapons are the truth of the Word of God and the power of the Holy Spirit in Him. He knew very well that by clinging to the Word of God, he will not be put to shame, he will survive. This is also our deepest assurance that by relying on God, on the power of His Word, we will be able to overcome the enticements of the Evil One that lead us to misery and destruction.

Let us be aware how the devil can also manipulate and interpret the Word of God to serve its own purpose. The temptations to power, wealth and prestige described in this Gospel narrative are presented in a very attractive way in such manner that it would appear logical to the human mind. Why not if it would benefit me and others? Jesus ultimately teaches us that there is more to life: "People do not live on bread alone," "You shall worship the Lord your God and serve him alone", and "You shall not challenge the Lord your God."

We are saved by Jesus Christ not through wealth, power and prestige, not through ambitions and self-preoccupations but by the humble death he assumed. We are all called to know and encounter Jesus.

Jesus was led by the Spirit out into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, after which he was very hungry, and the tempter came and said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to turn into loaves.' But he replied, 'Scripture says:

Man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.'

The devil then took him to the holy city and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God,' he said, 'throw yourself down; for scripture says:

#### **CATECHESIS**

#### Ash Wednesday

At the beginning of Lent, on Ash Wednesday, ashes are blessed during Mass, after the homily. The blessed ashes are then "imposed" on the faithful as a sign of conversion, penance, fasting and human mortality. The ashes are blessed at least during the first Mass of the day, but they may also be imposed during all the Masses of the day, after the homily, and even outside the time of Mass to meet the needs of the faithful. Priests or deacons normally impart this sacramental, but instituted acolytes, other extraordinary ministers or designated lay people may be delegated to impart ashes, if the bishop judges that this is necessary. The ashes are made from the palms used at the previous Passion Sunday ceremonies.

The act of putting on ashes symbolizes fragility and mortality, and the need to be redeemed by the mercy of God. Far from being a merely external act, the Church has retained the use of ashes to symbolize that attitude of internal penance to which all the baptized are called during Lent.

Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Alternatively, the priest may speak the words, "Repent and believe in the Gospel." Ashes also symbolize grief, in this case, grief that we have sinned and caused division from God.



#### Remembering Fr Sid Mosley

50 years ago on March 1st 1970 Fr Moseley celebrated his first mass as Parish Priest of the parish of St Michaels in South Blacktown after he was appointed by Cardinal Freeman when it was separated from St Patricks parish.

At the time masses were held in a building that had been relocated from a migrant centre at Scheyville since 1965.

Fr Moseley ushered in a decade of building development. Within the Five years in 1975, a presbytery was constructed which provided accommodation for priests and a housekeeper, meeting and interview rooms and an office.

In 1976 generous donations of money and labour enabled the construction of a new church. The new St Michaels church was dedicated on  $23^{rd}$  December, 1979 On  $14^{th}$  August, 1988 (on the eve on the Assumption), the parish was shocked by the death of Fr Moseley. He died suddenly while on a sabbatical to write a book. Fr Mosely is still fondly remembered by parishioners as a great builder of a new parish .


