"What is in a name?"

"Novel Coronavirus Officially Named" is the heading of an article published recently in the New England of Journal of Medicine. 'The 2019 novel coronavirus has been officially named severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) by the International Committee on Taxonomy of Viruses... Meanwhile, the World Health Organization (WHO) announced that the name of the illness from novel coronavirus is COVID-19, short for coronavirus disease.'

Naming this virus seems to be very important for them. But for the majority of us I think finding a vaccine is much more important. However, to name is essential in the process in dealing with this global crisis. WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus said under the agreed guidelines WHO "had to find a name that did not refer to a geographical location, an animal, an individual or group of people," to avoid stigmatization and to "avoid causing offence to any cultural, social, national, regional, professional or ethnic groups".

By virtue of our Baptism, we have been given a new identity as Christians. We were baptised by mentioning our name before the priest/deacon says the Trinitarian formula and pours the holy water on our head. We become brothers and sisters in Christ. This new identity must not only be by name but must be integrated in our whole being.

In this 7th of Ordinary Time, Year A, we have a Gospel reading (Matthew 5:38-48) which is part of the powerful Sermon on Mount (Matthew 5-7) where Jesus taught His disciples how to be authentic Christians. Jesus commanded us to "be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect." To fully achieve this perfection or holiness, Jesus has given us practical and transformative examples like loving our enemies and praying for those who persecute us.

We will begin the Season of Lent on Ash Wednesday. I hope and pray that one of the fruits of the Season of Lent is we become more authentic and faithful followers and witnesses of Jesus Christ. I earnestly pray too for the creation of a vaccine against SARS-CoV-2 or COVID-19. Tedros Ghebreyesus succinctly puts it: 'This a time for solidarity, not stigma.'

And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away.

'You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike. For if you love those who love you, what right have you to claim any credit? Even the tax collectors do as much, do they not? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not? You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.'



CATECHESIS

GUIDELINES FOR COMMUNICANTS

- 10. In the dioceses of Australia, standing is the most common posture to receive Holy Communion, though individual members of the faithful may choose to receive Communion while kneeling (GIRM 160).
- 11. When approaching to receive Holy Communion, bow in reverence of the Sacrament you are to receive (GIRM 160). A common posture and gesture help to symbolise the assembly's unity in Christ and also helps the communion procession to flow smoothly.
- 12. When receiving Communion in the hand, the communicant might be guided by the words of St Cyril of Jerusalem (313-386AD): "When you approach, take care not to do so with your hand stretched out and your fingers open or apart, but rather place your left hand as a throne beneath your right, as befits one who is about to receive the King. Then receive him, taking care that nothing is lost" (Cat. Myst V. 21-22). Communicants who are left- handed are obviously free to receive Communion on whichever hand they feel most comfortable.
- 13. As a sign of reverence for the Body of Christ, communicants and ministers should ensure that their hands appear clean.
- 14. When the minister says "The Body of Christ", reply "Amen" (GIRM 161). When receiving in the hand, step to one side after receiving the host and consume the whole of it immediately. When receiving on the tongue, communicants should open their mouths sufficiently and position their tongue to facilitate easy reception of the host.
