



Faith and Fear

This year has been a rough year for us in Australia. With drought, bushfires, floods, hail, and now COVID-19 and all that, that entails, it is quite easy for us to be overwhelmed by it all. Indeed, it is easy for us to lose our heads in the moment, to be swept up in toilet paper fights, to think that we must somehow stay in control of the situation. But that is actually the very point: we cannot control these situations, not entirely. All that we have had to endure this year is a reminder to us that we human beings, as much as we have developed a way of life that tries to control things with technology and management, cannot control everything.

There seems to be two ways to respond to this realisation, though, and unfortunately, we have all witnessed one way in recent days: the response of fear. Fear drives us to close in on ourselves, to lose sight of charity for others, to act without good judgement. Fear drives us to buy more toilet paper than we need for the next year and a half. Fear is a tool used by the devil to drive wedges between people, to cause division, and to dissuade people from looking at the situation with the eyes of hope and charity.

The other response is faith. Faith, though, is not some irrational, blind belief. This response of faith is the grace to see the situation within the order of reality that God has established: the reality that God exists, that he is all-wise, and all-powerful; that he is provident. This response of faith is the determination to turn to him in prayer, to storm heaven – not simply for ourselves, but for those worse off than us and for those tasked with leading us in this time. This response of faith is the commitment to be charitable and not allow our hearts to be closed to others, to drive us to care only for ourselves and leave everyone else to fend for themselves.

The realisation that we are not in control should liberate us. It should free us from the frenzied effort to stay in control, and allow our hearts to be filled with this faith that leads to charity. Our situation does not need more control. It needs more charity. It needs more faith.

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Cf. Ps 24:15-16

My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor.

FIRST READING: Ex 17:3-7

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Ps 94:1-2. 6-9. R.v.8

SECOND READING: Rom 5:1-2. 5-8

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Jn 4:42.15

Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ! Lord, you are truly the Saviour of the world; give me living water, that I may never thirst again. Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ!

GOSPEL: Jn 4:5-42

Jesus came to the Samaritan town called Sychar, near the land that Jacob gave to his son Joseph. Jacob's well is there and Jesus, tired by the journey, sat straight down by the well. It was about the sixth hour. When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, 'Give me a drink.' His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, 'What? You are a Jew and you ask me, a Samaritan, for a drink?' – Jews, in fact, do not associate with Samaritans. Jesus replied:

'If you only knew what God is offering and who it is that is saying to you: Give me a drink, you would have been the one to ask, and he would have given you living water.'

'You have no bucket, sir,' she answered 'and the well is deep: how could you get this living water? Are you a greater man than our father Jacob who gave us this well and drank from it himself with his sons and his cattle?' Jesus replied:

'Whoever drinks this water will get thirsty again; but anyone who drinks the water that I shall give will never be thirsty again: the water that I shall give will turn into a spring inside him, welling up to eternal life.'

'Sir,' said the woman, 'give me some of that water, so that I may never get thirsty and never have to come here again to draw water.' 'Go and call your husband' said Jesus to her 'and come back here.' The woman answered, 'I have no husband.' He said to her, 'You are right to say, "I have no husband"; for although you have had five, the one you have now is not your husband. You spoke the truth there.' 'I see you are a prophet, sir' said the woman. 'Our fathers worshipped on this mountain, while you say that Jerusalem is the place where one ought to worship.' Jesus said:

'Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You worship what you do not know; we worship what you do not know; for salvation comes from the Jews. But the hour will come – in fact it is here already – when true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth: that is the kind of worshipper the Father wants. God is spirit, and those who worship must worship in spirit and truth.'

The woman said to him, 'I know that Messiah – that is, Christ – is coming; and when he comes he will tell us everything.' 'I who am speaking to you,' said Jesus 'I am he.'

At this point his disciples returned, and were surprised to find him speaking to a woman, though none of them asked, 'What do you want from her?' or, 'Why are you talking to her?' The woman put down her water jar and hurried back to the town to tell the people, 'Come and see a man who has told me everything I ever did; I wonder if he is the Christ?' This brought people out of the town and they started walking towards him.

Meanwhile, the disciples were urging him, 'Rabbi, do have something to eat'; but he said, 'I have food to eat that you do not know about.' So the disciples asked one another, 'Has someone been bringing him food?' But Jesus said: 'My food is to do the will of the one who sent me, and to complete his work. Have you not got a saying: Four months and then the harvest? Well, I tell you: Look around you, look at the fields; already they are white, ready for harvest! Already the reaper is being paid his wages, already he is bringing in the grain for eternal life, and thus sower and reaper rejoice together. For here the proverb holds good:

one sows, another reaps; I sent you to reap a harvest you had not worked for. Others worked for it; and you have come into the rewards of their trouble.'

Many Samaritans of that town had believed in him on the strength of the woman's testimony when she said, 'He told me all I have ever done', so, when the Samaritans came up to him, they begged him to stay with them. He stayed for two days, and when he spoke to them many more came to believe; and they said to the woman, 'Now we no longer believe because of what you told us; we have heard him ourselves and we know that he really is the saviour of the world.'

CATECHESIS ON THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK—PART 1

The anointing of the sick is administered to bring spiritual and even physical strength during an illness, especially near the time of death. IT IS MOST LIKELY ONE OF THE LAST SACRAMENTS ONE WILL RECEIVE. A sacrament is an outward sign established by Jesus Christ to confer inward grace. In more basic terms, it is a rite that is performed to convey God's grace to the recipient, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

The Sacrament's Institution

Like all the sacraments, holy anointing was instituted by Jesus Christ during his earthly ministry. The Catechism explains, "This sacred anointing of the sick was instituted by Christ our Lord as a true and proper sacrament of the New Testament. It is alluded to indeed by Mark, but is recommended to the faithful and promulgated by James the apostle and brother of the Lord" (CCC 1511; Mark 6:13; Jas. 5:14-15).

The anointing of the sick conveys several graces and imparts gifts of strengthening in the Holy Spirit against anxiety, discouragement, and temptation, and conveys peace and fortitude (CCC 1520). These graces flow from the atoning death of Jesus Christ, for "this was to fulfil what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah, 'He took our infirmities and bore our diseases" (Matt. 8:17).

Mark refers to the sacrament when he recounts how Jesus sent out the twelve disciples to preach, and "they cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many that were sick and healed them" (Mark 6:13). In his epistle, James says, "Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven" (Jas. 5:14-15).




