Oftentimes we wonder what God would say to us in the particular moment we are in. Sometimes we even hope that he would speak out and offer us some special word to help us through the moment, or endure the trial, or guide our confused minds. The good news is that very often (indeed I'm willing to bet always) he already has spoken that word. We just haven't looked for it; or having begun looking, haven't found it yet.

This week gives us a perfect example of this. We have endured many weeks of being locked out of churches, away from Mass and the sacraments as we normal know them and we have all probably wondered: where is Jesus in all this? We haven't been connecting with him in the manner we are used to. So, we wonder whether he is still just as close, whether he is with us as he was before. Well he gave us the answer about 2000 years ago and we hear it in the Gospel this Sunday: 'know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.' Where is Jesus in all this? Right here, with us.

Perhaps this time of being locked out of our churches is teaching us to not lock Jesus in there. And I don't mean that the church shouldn't be a sacred place to be respected and treated with reverence – it most definitely is. I mean we all have the tendency to see our union with Jesus as the thing that happens at church, and leave the rest of our lives without him. We fulfil our Sunday obligation but then live the rest of the week without him. Perhaps this time is a reminder to us from Jesus that he ascended into heaven not to escape from us and leave us stranded, but in order to make his home in all of us. He ascended so that his home would not just be in Jerusalem or Galilee but in the hearts and homes of Christians throughout the world and throughout time.

Jesus wants a deep and personal union with each of us. A union that is not limited to coming to the church on Sunday, but a union that permeates everything in our lives. As we contemplate his ascension this week, let us invite him to make his home in our hearts and our homes.

Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

• Baptisms. One family is allowed to have their child baptised with only 10 attendees. Contact the Parish Office for details.

- Weddings. Up to 10 persons plus the couple, the celebrant and assisting ministers are permitted. Contact the Parish Office for details.
- Funerals. 20 mourners indoors or 30 mourners outdoors are permitted for funerals, in addition to clergy and funeral directors.

CATECHESIS

"He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father"

659 "So then the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven, and sat down at the right hand of God."⁵³² Christ's body was glorified at the moment of his Resurrection, as proved by the new and supernatural properties it subsequently and permanently enjoys.⁵³³ But during the forty days when he eats and drinks familiarly with his disciples and teaches them about the kingdom, his glory remains veiled under the appearance of ordinary humanity.⁵³⁴ Jesus' final apparition ends with the irreversible entry of his humanity into divine glory, symbolized by the cloud and by heaven, where he is seated from that time forward at God's right hand.⁵³⁵ Only in a wholly exceptional and unique way would Jesus show himself to Paul "as to one untimely born", in a last apparition that established him as an apostle.⁵³⁶

<u>660</u> The veiled character of the glory of the Risen One during this time is intimated in his mysterious words to Mary Magdalene: "I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to my brethren and say to them, I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God."⁵³⁷ This indicates a difference in manifestation between the glory of the risen Christ and that of the Christ exalted to the Father's right hand, a transition marked by the historical and transcendent event of the Ascension.

661 This final stage stays closely linked to the first, that is, to his descent from heaven in the Incarnation. Only the one who "came from the Father" can return to the Father: Christ Jesus.⁵³⁸ "No one has ascended into heaven but he who descended from heaven, the Son of man."⁵³⁹ Left to its own natural powers humanity does not have access to the "Father's house", to God's life and happiness.⁵⁴⁰ Only Christ can open to man such access that we, his members, might have confidence that we too shall go where he, our Head and our Source, has preceded us.⁵⁴¹

662 "And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all men to myself."⁵⁴² The lifting up of Jesus on the cross signifies and announces his lifting up by his Ascension into heaven, and indeed begins it. Jesus Christ, the one priest of the new and eternal Covenant, "entered, not into a sanctuary made by human hands. . . but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf."⁵⁴³ There Christ permanently exercises his priesthood, for he "always lives to make intercession" for "those who draw near to God through him".⁵⁴⁴ As "high priest of the good things to come" he is the center and the principal actor of the liturgy that honours the Father in heaven.⁵⁴⁵

663 Henceforth Christ is seated at the right hand of the Father: "By 'the Father's right hand' we understand the glory and honour of divinity, where he who exists as Son of God before all ages, indeed as God, of one being with the Father, is seated bodily after he became incarnate and his flesh was glorified."⁵⁴⁶

664 Being seated at the Father's right hand signifies the inauguration of the Messiah's kingdom, the fulfilment of the prophet Daniel's vision concerning the Son of man: "To him was given dominion and glory and kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him; his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom one that shall not be destroyed."⁵⁴⁷ After this event the apostles became witnesses of the "kingdom [that] will have no end".⁵⁴⁸
