The Birth of the Missionary Church

This Sunday we celebrate one of the major feasts of our Church: Pentecost Sunday. 'Pentecost' comes from the Greek word meaning 'fiftieth'. It is the fiftieth day since the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. We celebrate and experience the powerful outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the whole church and on all those who call themselves disciples and followers of the risen Lord.

The coming of the Holy Spirit has been revealed by Jesus to His disciples. He promised his followers that he would send them the Holy Spirit. He also revealed to them the purpose and role of the Holy Spirit, i.e. another Advocate. The Holy Spirit is to teach them everything and remind them of the teachings of Jesus Christ (cf. John 14:26).

This Pentecost Sunday is a day when we celebrate the birth of our Church. On this day, we are reminded to be missionary disciples of Jesus Christ. We are sent out to the whole world to proclaim the good news of Jesus. We need courage to do this. We know that the first followers of Jesus were not strong, courageous, or even very faithful. They betrayed Jesus. They denied and deserted him when he needed them the most. After his death they hid themselves away in fear. They had lost all heart and hope. Jesus knows well that those who will continue His mission needs help. Consequently, together with the Father, He sent the Holy Spirit to guide and help us in our task as missionary disciples.

The feast day of Pentecost reminds us that through our baptism and confirmation, all of us are filled and anointed with the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit challenges and calls us to be transformed. As we celebrate the birth of the missionary Church, may we bear fruit with the fruits of the Holy Spirit—'love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control' (Galatians 5:22-23).

CATECHESIS

"I believe in the Holy Spirit"

687 "No one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God." Now God's Spirit, who reveals God, makes known to us Christ, his Word, his living Utterance, but the Spirit does not speak of himself. The Spirit who "has spoken through the prophets" makes us hear the Father's Word, but we do not hear the Spirit himself. We know him only in the movement by which he reveals the Word to us and disposes us to welcome him in faith. The Spirit of truth who "unveils" Christ to us "will not speak on his own." Such properly divine selfeffacement explains why "the world cannot receive [him], because it neither sees him nor knows him," while those who believe in Christ know the Spirit because he dwells with them.

688 The Church, a communion living in the faith of the apostles which she transmits, is the place where we know the Holy Spirit:

- in the Scriptures he inspired;
- in the Tradition, to which the Church Fathers are always timely witnesses;
- in the Church's Magisterium, which he assists;
- in the sacramental liturgy, through its words and symbols, in which the Holy Spirit puts us into communion with Christ:
- in prayer, wherein he intercedes for us;
- in the charisms and ministries by which the Church is built up;
- in the signs of apostolic and missionary life;
- -in the witness of saints through whom he manifests his holiness and continues the work of salvation.

689 The One whom the Father has sent into our hearts, the Spirit of his Son, is truly God. Consubstantial with the Father and the Son, the Spirit is inseparable from them, in both the inner life of the Trinity and his gift of love for the world. In adoring the Holy Trinity, life-giving, consubstantial, and indivisible, the Church's faith also professes the distinction of persons. When the Father sends his Word, he always sends his Breath. In their joint mission, the Son and the Holy Spirit are distinct but inseparable. To be sure, it is Christ who is seen, the visible image of the invisible God, but it is the Spirit who reveals him.
