Mary, Queen of the Family Parish is a welcoming, diverse, multicultural, Catholic community.

We seek: to live, teach and share the joy of the Gospel; to grow as disciples of Jesus through prayer, witness and action and to respond to the needs of the family in the Blacktown community and beyond.



A prophetic people

Jeremiah laments his hardship as a prophet (first reading), and Jesus asks his followers to be brave in promoting their faith (Gospel). They imply that all members of the People of God are potentially prophetic and need to play their part in handing on the truth about God. In a sense, we are all successors to Jeremiah and to the apostles whose job it was to share Christ's message with the world.

Not all Christians have equal opportunities of being spokespersons for God. Clergy have the official duty of encouraging and teaching the faithful. Their difficult but worthwhile task is to faithfully hand on Christ's teaching, and correct errors that threaten the integrity of the traditional Christian doctrine or ethical standards. Like Jeremiah and other Old Testament prophets, they remind their people of God's revealed will and of the high moral standards God asks of us. And, like the prophets, priests can often expect criticism and opposition, just for doing their job.

Theologians too have an important work to fulfil in the Church, to deeply study the revealed truth, and then blend that traditional teaching with modern knowledge, so as to honestly apply the Christian message to new problems. To help them in this daunting work they have the light of the same Holy Spirit who guided the prophets of old, provided they do their research not as masters but as servants of the word of God. But it is not only priests and theologians who have the prophetic role towards God's people. The Second Vatican Council taught that every Christian should give a living witness to. Christ, at least through living a life of faith and charity and by joining in worship and prayer.

This is not such an easy matter. The spirit of today's society, the example of our contemporaries, and the irreligious mood of much of the media do not always foster God-fearing attitudes or encourage sound moral standards. In most countries today, Christians are not persecuted for showing faith in Christ and his Gospel, but when she or he lives according to this teaching they will be swimming against the tide of a materialistic culture and will not find the going easy. Jesus warns that being a Christian will cost sacrifice and suffering. We are bound to face opposition from a world that does not gladly submit to the word of God, that makes so many demands on human nature. But there is real satisfaction, too, in standing up for the truth of things. In the centre of their souls, prophetic people have the happiness of working with the Lord, who is the ultimate truth on whom we all depend.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

LIFE IN CHRIST

1691 "Christian, recognize your dignity and, now that you share in God's own nature, do not return to your former base condition by sinning. Remember who is your head and of whose body you are a member. Never forget that you have been rescued from the power of darkness and brought into the light of the Kingdom of God."

1693 Christ Jesus always did what was pleasing to the *Father*, and always lived in perfect communion with him. Likewise, Christ's disciples are invited to live in the sight of the Father "who sees in secret," in order to become "perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect."

1694 Incorporated into Christ by Baptism, Christians are "dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus" and so participate in the life of the Risen Lord. Following Christ and united with him, Christians can strive to be "imitators of God as beloved children, and walk in love" by conforming their thoughts, words and actions to the "mind . . . which is yours in Christ Jesus," and by following his example.

1696 The way of Christ "leads to life"; a contrary way "leads to destruction." The Gospel parable of the two ways remains ever present in the catechesis of the Church; it shows the importance of moral decisions for our salvation: "There are two ways, the one of life, the other of death; but between the two, there is a great difference."

1698 The first and last point of reference of this catechesis will always be Jesus Christ himself, who is "the way, and the truth, and the life." It is by looking to him in faith that Christ's faithful can hope that he himself fulfils his promises in them, and that, by loving him with the same love with which he has loved them, they may perform works in keeping with their dignity.



UPDATE ON THE RE-OPENING OF CHURCH

As mandated by NSW Government, those who enter the church must **complete the sign-in form** available in the church foyer. **Physical distancing** must be strictly observed at all times.

- St Patricks and St Michael Churches are open for **private prayer and devotions**, Mon-Fri 9:35am to 4pm. Please see Parish Office Staff to open the church door.
- Sacrament of Reconciliation/Confession. Regular schedule. If you wish to come on weekdays, contact the Parish Office.
- Regular Weekday and Weekend Masses. Because only 50 people are allowed at any one time in the church building, booking is necessary, if you wish to come to Mass. To book, call 02 9622 1125 between 9am to 4pm, Monday to Friday or book via our website: www.mqofblacktown.org.au.
- **Baptisms**. One family is allowed to have their child baptised with only 50 attendees. Contact the Parish Office for details.
- Anointing of the Sick. Contact the Parish Office.
- Weddings. Up to 20 persons plus the couple, the celebrant and assisting ministers are permitted. Contact the Parish Office for details.
- Funerals. 50 mourners are permitted, in addition to clergy and funeral directors.
- The elderly, those with health conditions and low immune system are still advised to stay at home.
- Sanitiser dispensers are available at the church foyer.
- Please disinfect the chair you used before leaving the church with the disinfecting wipes provided at the church foyer.

Sacramental Process 2020

We are now allowed to go ahead with the Sacraments whilst adhering to the current government restrictions. Hence, we request your understanding and cooperation at this time.

Below are some details of the process. Please read the following carefully before enrolling.

- For those who have not yet enrolled, enrolments for the Sacraments of Confirmation, First Holy Eucharist and Reconciliation are now open until Friday, 26th June 2020. Enrolment forms are available on the Parish website under Sacraments.
- Dates and sessions times are to be changed to adapt to the Covid-19 situation and restrictions. You will be contacted with the details via email, once the enrolments are in.
- The Confirmation process will take place in August, First Holy Eucharist in mid-October to mid-November, and Reconciliation in mid-November to mid-December.
- Please note that on the day of the Confirmation, each candidate will be allowed five family members only. This includes the sponsor.
- Please also note that on the day of the Sacrament of First Holy Eucharist and Reconciliation the child will be accompanied by both parents only.

APPEAL FROM THE PARISH FINANCE COMMITTEE

Dear fellow parishioners,

I'm Michael Zerafa, MOOF Parish Finance Committee Chair.

It's wonderful that Sunday and weekday Masses have returned to our parish, albeit, limited to just 50 persons per Mass.

Diane and I have been blessed to be able to attend Mass as readers. It was wonderful to receive communion once again and to see some familiar faces.

The reason for my message today is, to provide you with an update with regards to parish finances:

Thank you to everyone who has continued to give through Planned Giving via credit card or bank account deduction during our time of closure. You have helped keep our parish running.

Thank you also, to all of you who took up our call to change their Planned Giving from envelopes to automatic deduction from a credit card or bank account. It's much appreciated and has also helped us immensely.

For those of you who give regularly via envelopes, the parish team are busily preparing the envelopes for the incoming financial year. A big thank you to Len and Cita who have been assisting Sarah with this.

Should you wish to start giving through Planned Giving, please contact the Parish Office on 9622 1125 for assistance with setting this up.

The resumption of Masses means that you can now give at our churches. Whilst we can't pass around the collection plates, you'll find 2 buckets on a table at the main entrances to both churches - one marked First Collection, the other, Second Collection. Money placed in the First Collection bucket will go to the Diocese whilst, anything placed in the Second Collection bucket will go directly to the support of our parish. The buckets will be available at all Masses, including weekday Masses and, will be cleared after each Mass. Please come prepared to Mass after you've registered and, give generously if you

And, don't forget, our Tap and Go Terminals can be found in their usual spots at both churches. Each tap of these terminals will see \$10 deducted from your credit card or bank account and transferred to our parish account. A second terminal will soon be installed at St Michael's church.

In a future bulletin, I'll provide you with an update on what's happening with the appeal we launched to raise funds to replace the Sound and Video Systems at St Patrick's church, just prior to the pandemic as well as what's happening with the installation of air conditioning and solar panels at both our churches too.
