OUR MISSION STATEMENT

Mary, Queen of the Family Parish is a welcoming, diverse, multicultural, Catholic community.

We seek: to live, teach and share the joy of the Gospel; to grow as disciples of Jesus through prayer, witness and action and to respond to the needs of the family in the Blacktown community and beyond.



It is very easy for us, when we read the Old Testament, to look at Israel and think, 'Why would they refuse the Lord so often when he had done so much for them? How could they not see all he has done? Why would they turn away?' Indeed, we don't even have to look at the Old Testament: I'm sure many of us have seen others who know they should be doing one thing, but somehow cannot bring themselves to do it. And standing from our position we just think it's so easy: why can't they just do it?

The reason they can't do it; the reason Israel, despite knowing all that God had done for them, kept refusing the Lord was because they suffered from what the Scriptures call hardness of heart. This is a spiritual malady that is caused entirely by consistently refusing to surrender to the Lord's will. And what happens is that at each refusal, at each act of stubbornness, one's heart grows that little bit more coarse, that little bit harder, until one's heart is as hard as a rock. It's a bit like growing a callus: you rub and bump and scrape a part of your skin so much that over time it becomes hard and impervious.

And there can be many reasons for this hardness of heart. Often it is because we think we know better. So, we refuse to listen to the wisdom of someone else; or refuse to be taught; or refuse to believe that God might have a better plan than us. Sometimes it is because of fear: we don't like being in the middle of some unknown path; we don't know how it will end or where it is leading to, and so we say no because of the fear.

The trick is that we can read the Old Testament and blame Israel, or read the New Testament and blame the scribes and Pharisees, or even just think of that friend who knows they should quit that job but simply won't, and forget that we do exactly the same thing. We are just as much prone to this hardness of heart as anyone in Israel was, particularly if we like to point out other's hardness of heart and never look at our own. Instead, we must be like the first son in the Gospel this Sunday: be quick to turn our hearts back to the Lord so that they do not grow hard.

Which of the two did the father's will?' 'The first' they said. Jesus said to them, 'I tell you solemnly, tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the kingdom of God before you. For John came to you, a pattern of true righteousness, but you did not believe him, and yet the tax collectors and prostitutes did. Even after seeing that, you refused to think better of it and believe in him.'

Catechism of the Catholic Church

THE DEFINITION OF SIN

1849 Sin is an offense against reason, truth, and right conscience; it is failure in genuine love for God and neighbour caused by a perverse attachment to certain goods. It wounds the nature of man and injures human solidarity. It has been defined as "an utterance, a deed, or a desire contrary to the eternal law."

1850 Sin is an offense against God: "Against you, you alone, have I sinned, and done that which is evil in your sight." Sin sets itself against God's love for us and turns our hearts away from it. Like the first sin, it is disobedience, a revolt against God through the will to become "like gods," knowing and determining good and evil. Sin is thus "love of oneself even to contempt of God." In this proud self- exaltation, sin is diametrically opposed to the obedience of Jesus, which achieves our salvation.

THE GRAVITY OF SIN: MORTAL AND VENIAL SIN

1854 Sins are rightly evaluated according to their gravity. The distinction between mortal and venial sin, already evident in Scripture, became part of the tradition of the Church. It is corroborated by human experience.

1855 Mortal sin destroys charity in the heart of man by a grave violation of God's law; it turns man away from God, who is his ultimate end and his beatitude, by preferring an inferior good to him. Venial sin allows charity to subsist, even though it offends and wounds it.

1856 Mortal sin, by attacking the vital principle within us - that is, charity - necessitates a new initiative of God's mercy and a conversion of heart which is normally accomplished within the setting of the sacrament of reconciliation.

1857 For a sin to be mortal, three conditions must together be met: "Mortal sin is sin whose object is grave matter and which is also committed with full knowledge and deliberate consent."

MQOF COVID-19 SAFETY PLAN KEY POINTS

as of August 2020

- Following the most recent NSW Health advice, the Diocese of Parramatta highly recommends all worshippers in the Diocese to wear a mask at Masses and other services. This would be as people arrive on parish grounds, during Mass or the service and afterwards as they leave. During Communion, the mask may be removed, but it should be in place at all other times.
- With the regulations in place, St Patrick's Church can only accommodate 100 people and 90 for St Michael's Church at each Mass and service. Therefore, we request that you make a booking via Online or by contacting the Parish Office during office hours. BOOKING IS NECESSARY.
- On arrival at the church, please sanitize your hands using the sanitizer supplied at the foyer.
- You are required to confirm your name on the registration sheet. If you haven't made a booking, you will be asked to provide your name and a contact number for contact tracing purposes as mandated by the NSW Government.
- Please sit on the designated chairs. However, if you are from the same family group, you are allowed to sit together.
- During Communion, please form one line and you are required to maintain physical distancing at all times.
- At the conclusion of Mass, please disinfect the chair you used before leaving with the disinfecting wipes provided at the church foyer.
- You are requested not to socialize inside or outside the church but leave as soon as possible after Mass.
- You are not allowed to enter the church if you are experiencing cold or flu-like symptoms, have a temperature, been in contact with anyone that is either a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19 even if you have made a Mass booking.
- We understand the inconvenience the above may pose, but the health of our parishioners and the wider community is our highest concern.

TAP & GO MACHINE


The passing of collection plates by parishioners along the pews is now a thing of the past as most dioceses and churches have already decided to stop using it to help stop the spread of the virus.

Sacramental Process 2020




Enrolments are now closed. We are doing our best to offer the sacraments, whilst adhering to the current government restrictions.
