OUR MISSION STATEMENT

Mary, Queen of the Family Parish is a welcoming, diverse, multicultural, Catholic community.

We seek: to live, teach and share the joy of the Gospel; to grow as disciples of Jesus through prayer, witness and action and to respond to the needs of the family in the Blacktown community and beyond.



Some people have the expectation that Christians should be the most well behaved and peaceful of all people. And so, when they hear Christians failing to live up to the high standards of their Saviour, they are scandalised and think, 'Hypocrites! There they are telling everyone how to live, but they are no better!'

This is not only unrealistic but quite unfair. We are not Christians because we are perfect (or think we are). We are Christians because we want to try and get there; we know we need Jesus.

Luckily, Jesus is a bit more realistic. He foresaw that Christians would not live without any conflict whatsoever. And so, he gave us a clear pattern of how to deal with conflict amongst fellow Christians, which we see in the Gospel this weekend.

He says first, 'If your brother does something wrong'. This means that before we confront someone, we should be reasonably sure that there is something to correct. This implies that there is right and wrong, that people can choose either, and that we can determine whether they have chosen well or badly.

Next, Jesus says, 'go and have it out with him alone'. This is the first step for Christians in handling conflict. It is not gossip or rumours or even sweeping things under the carpet. We go directly to the person. This is the just thing to do: let them explain themselves.

If this does not work, then Jesus says to take some support with you, some witnesses. The reason for this is that it demonstrates to the person that it is not personal. You are not simply out to get them. It shows that you are genuinely concerned for their salvation and so are others.

However, if even this does not work, then Jesus says we take it 'to the community'. Does that mean we take it to Facebook? Is that the community Jesus means? No, he means the Church. A helpful way to think of it might be to take it to the next authority, to 'go higher up', as it were. If, for example, it is a problem in a ministry group, we take it to the ministry leader, if it's a problem with a priest, we take it to the bishop.

If even that does not work, then we 'treat them like a pagan'. Now that does not mean we forget about them. It does mean that we accept their determination to remain at odds with us, but we also then intercede for them and remain willing to offer them the mercy of Jesus, just as Jesus did to pagans and tax collectors.

Hopefully, it never comes to that. We have all these other steps before this. Too often, though, we fall into patterns of the world that ignore the first steps and go straight to the last. Christ gave us a different path, and we should follow that.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

"OUR FATHER"

2779 Before we make our own this first exclamation of the Lord's Prayer, we must humbly cleanse our hearts of certain false images drawn "from this world." *Humility* makes us recognize that "no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him," that is, "to little children." The *purification* of our hearts has to do with paternal or maternal images, stemming from our personal and cultural history, and influencing our relationship with God. God our Father transcends the categories of the created world. To impose our own ideas in this area "upon him" would be to fabricate idols to adore or pull down. To pray to the Father is to enter into his mystery as he is and as the Son has revealed him to

<u>2780</u> We can invoke God as "Father" because *he is revealed to us* by his Son become man and because his Spirit makes him known to us. The personal relation of the Son to the Father is something that man cannot conceive of nor the angelic powers even dimly see: and yet, the Spirit of the Son grants a participation in that very relation to us who believe that Jesus is the Christ and that we are born of God.

2781 When we pray to the Father, we are *in communion with him* and with his Son, Jesus Christ. Then we know and recognize him with an ever new sense of wonder. The first phrase of the Our Father is a blessing of adoration before it is a supplication. For it is the glory of God that we should recognize him as "Father," the true God. We give him thanks for having revealed his name to us, for the gift of believing in it, and for the indwelling of his Presence in us.




MQOF COVID-19 SAFETY PLAN KEY POINTS

as of August 2020

- Following the most recent NSW Health advice, the Diocese of Parramatta highly recommends all worshippers in the Diocese to wear a mask at Masses and other services. This would be as people arrive on parish grounds, during Mass or the service and afterwards as they leave. During Communion, the mask may be removed, but it should be in place at all other times.
- With the regulations in place, St Patrick's Church can only accommodate 100 people and 90 for St Michael's Church at each Mass and service. Therefore, we request that you make a booking via Online or by contacting the Parish Office during office hours. BOOKING IS NECESSARY.
- On arrival at the church, please sanitize your hands using the sanitizer supplied at the foyer.
- You are required to confirm your name on the registration sheet. If you haven't made a booking, you will be asked to provide your name and a contact number for contact tracing purposes as mandated by the NSW Government.
- Please sit on the designated chairs. However, if you are from the same family group, you are allowed to sit together.
- During Communion, please form one line and you are required to maintain physical distancing at all times.
- At the conclusion of Mass, please disinfect the chair you used before leaving with the disinfecting wipes provided at the church foyer.
- You are requested not to socialize inside or outside the church but leave as soon as possible after Mass.
- You are not allowed to enter the church if you are experiencing cold or flu-like symptoms, have a temperature, been in contact with anyone that is either a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19 even if you have made a Mass booking.
- We understand the inconvenience the above may pose, but the health of our parishioners and the wider community is our highest concern.

We sincerely thank you for understanding, and for playing your part in keeping our community safe.


