Make Us Love What You Command

In our Collect (Opening Prayer) for this 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we humbly pray to our Almighty ever-living God to 'make us love what you command'. We do not need to only hear and know God's commandments, but we must love his commandments. In other words, we must faithfully observe his commandments.

Like last Sunday's Gospel, Jesus is once again in a face-to-face encounter with his adversaries—the Pharisees. They tried to disconcert Jesus by asking him, "*Master, which is the greatest commandment of the Law*" (Mt 22:36). It is a tricky question to Jesus as he was asked that out of the more than 600 precepts from the Law of Moses, he must point out the greatest commandment.

But Jesus responds without hesitation: "*You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind*". And he adds: "*You shall love your neighbour as yourself*" (Mt 22:37, 39).

How do we know if you are in love with someone? The people around you will surely know through your words and actions when you are in love. Similarly, if we truly love God, everyone around us should know that we genuinely love God through our prayers, our regular participation in the Holy Mass and our actions in relation to how we treat and relate with those people whom we encounter in our life. God must have a massive space in our life especially during this time of pandemic. Let us not just be content with the Spiritual Communion. We must physically encounter him truly and fully present in the Holy Eucharist.

May Mary, Queen of the Family, intercede for us in faithfully observing these two important and greatest commandments of love of God and neighbour. We must love his commandments of LOVE!

Catechism of the Catholic Church

Communion of the Saints.

954 The three states of the Church. "When the Lord comes in glory, and all his angels with him, death will be no more and all things will be subject to him. But at the present time some of his disciples are pilgrims on earth. Others have died and are being purified, while still others are in glory, contemplating 'in full light, God himself triune and one, exactly as he is':⁴⁹⁰

All of us, however, in varying degrees and in different ways share in the same charity towards God and our neighbours, and we all sing the one hymn of glory to our God. All, indeed, who are of Christ and who have his Spirit form one Church and in Christ cleave together.⁴⁹¹

955 "So it is that the union of the wayfarers with the brethren who sleep in the peace of Christ is in no way interrupted, but on the contrary, according to the constant faith of the Church, this union is reinforced by an exchange of spiritual goods."⁴⁹²

956 The intercession of the saints. "Being more closely united to Christ, those who dwell in heaven fix the whole Church more firmly in holiness.... They do not cease to intercede with the Father for us, as they proffer the merits which they acquired on earth through the one mediator between God and men, Christ Jesus.... So by their fraternal concern is our weakness greatly helped."⁴⁹³

Do not weep, for I shall be more useful to you after my death and I shall help you then more effectively than during my life.⁴⁹⁴
I want to spend my heaven in doing good on earth.⁴⁹⁵

957 Communion with the saints. "It is not merely by the title of example that we cherish the memory of those in heaven; we seek, rather, that by this devotion to the exercise of fraternal charity the union of the whole Church in the Spirit may be strengthened. Exactly as Christian communion among our fellow pilgrims brings us closer to Christ, so our communion with the saints joins us to Christ, from whom as from its fountain and head issues all grace, and the life of the People of God itself"⁴⁹⁶: We worship Christ as God's Son; we love the martyrs as the Lord's disciples and imitators, and rightly so because of their matchless devotion towards their king and master. May we also be their companions and fellow disciples!⁴⁹⁷

958 Communion with the dead. "In full consciousness of this communion of the whole Mystical Body of Jesus Christ, the Church in its pilgrim members, from the very earliest days of the Christian religion, has honored with great respect the memory of the dead; and 'because it is a holy and a wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins' she offers her suffrages for them."⁴⁹⁸ Our prayer for them is capable not only of helping them, but also of making their intercession for us effective.

959 In the one family of God. "For if we continue to love one another and to join in praising the Most Holy Trinity - all of us who are sons of God and form one family in Christ - we will be faithful to the deepest vocation of the Church."⁴⁹⁹

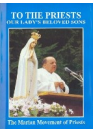

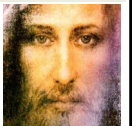

MQOF COVID-19 SAFETY PLAN KEY POINTS

- Following the most recent NSW Health advice, the Diocese of Parramatta highly recommends all worshippers in the Diocese to wear a mask at Masses and other services. This would be as people arrive on parish grounds, during Mass or the service and afterwards as they leave. During Communion, the mask may be removed, but it should be in place at all other times.
- With the regulations in place, St Patrick's Church can accommodate only 250 people and 90 for St Michael's Church at each Mass and service. Therefore, we request that you make a booking via Online or by contacting the Parish Office during office hours. **BOOKING IS NECESSARY.**
- On arrival at the church, please sanitize your hands using the sanitizer supplied at the foyer.
- You are required to confirm your name on the registration sheet. If you haven't made a booking, you will be asked to provide your name and a contact number for contact tracing purposes as mandated by the NSW Government.
- Please sit on the designated chairs. However, if you are from the same family group, you are allowed to sit together.
-
- During Communion, please form one line and you are required to maintain physical distancing at all times.
- At the conclusion of Mass, please disinfect the chair you used before leaving with the disinfecting wipes provided at the church foyer.
- You are requested not to socialize inside or outside the church but leave as soon as possible after Mass.
- You are not allowed to enter the church if you are experiencing cold or flu-like symptoms, have a temperature, been in contact with anyone that is either a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19 even if you have made a Mass booking.
- We understand the inconvenience the above may pose, but the health of our parishioners and the wider community is our highest concern.

We sincerely thank you for understanding, and for playing your part in keeping our community safe.
