"The Five-Finger Gospel"

The Solemnity of Christ the King closes the liturgical calendar of the Ordinary Time. The following week begins the season of Advent anticipating the great feast of the coming of the Son of God, of the Word made flesh, of the presence of God in humanity through Jesus Christ. This King uttered these words in our Gospel this Sunday (Matthew 25:31-46), "I assure you, as often as you did it for one of my least brothers (and sisters), you did for me." "You-did-it-for-me." Mother Teresa of Calcutta was deeply touched by these words of Jesus that all throughout her life as a Missionary of Charity she served her King and master who said these words to her and to all of us. She championed in the world this beautiful image of a five-finger Gospel.

She said, "Our work for the poor is so real so beautiful because if our heart is pure we can see, we can touch Jesus twenty-four hours because He has made it so clear: 'Whatever you do to the least of my brethren- You-did-it-to-Me. The Gospel in our five fingers- that is why we need that deep life of prayer- that will help us to grow in that intimate and personal love for Jesus and complete attachment to Him- so that our sisters and our poor can see Jesus in us, His love, His compassion." She knew very well what poverty really means and why Jesus is thirsting for us to satisfy him, to serve him as a King who first of all offered his life on the cross as a service, as a work for our salvation.

Mother Teresa reminds the world, however, that poverty is not only material, but also of love. This is the most challenging one to address especially when our hearts are hardened with greed, selfishness and pride. The exact antithesis of love is not hatred but indifference. Our self-centeredness blinds us to look beyond that there are so many who are hungry, thirsty, abandoned. We can only give what we have. This is the reason why we must come to the one who loved us first. Mother Teresa always begins her day adoring our Eucharistic King, united with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and then serve him in others especially the poorest of the poor.

Saint Paul (1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28) reiterates that at the end of time Christ will come as a King over all, "When, after having destroyed every sovereignty, authority and power, will hand over the kingdom to God the Father. Christ must reign until God has put all enemies under his feet, and the last enemy to be destroyed is death. When, finally, all has been subjected to the Son, he will then subject himself to the One who made all things subject to him, so that God may be all in all." The ultimate criterion of judgment Jesus proposed in the Gospel narrative is the measure in which we love others especially the poor, the weak, and the vulnerable. For whatever we do to them, we do it for Jesus. This is simply the five-finger Gospel!

### GOSPEL: Mt 25:31-46

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me.' Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'

### **Catechism of the Catholic Church**

### The Catholic Church and Holy Communion

The Catholic Church sets out specific guidelines regarding how we should prepare ourselves to receive the Lord's body and blood in Communion. First, you must be in a state of grace. "Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a man examine himself, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup" (1 Cor. 11:27–28). This is an absolute requirement that can never be dispensed. To receive the Eucharist without sanctifying grace in your soul profanes the Eucharist in the most grievous manner.

A mortal sin is any sin whose matter is grave and which has been committed willfully and with knowledge of its seriousness. Grave matter includes, but is not limited to, murder, receiving or participating in an abortion, homosexual acts, having sexual intercourse outside of marriage or in an invalid marriage, and deliberately engaging in impure thoughts (Matt. 5:28–29). Scripture contains lists of mortal sins (for example, 1 Cor. 6:9-10 and Gal. 5:19-21). For further information on what constitutes a mortal sin, see the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

The Church's ancient teaching on this particular matter is expressed in the Didache, an early Christian document written around A.D. 70, which states: "Whosoever is holy [i.e., in a state of sanctifying grace], let him approach. Whosoever is not, let him repent" (Didache 10).

Second, you must have been to confession since your last mortal sin. The Didache witnesses to this practice of the early Church. "But first make confession of your faults, so that your sacrifice may be a pure one" (Didache 14).

The 1983 Code of Canon Law indicates that the same requirement applies today. "A person who is conscious of a grave sin is not to . . . receive the body of the Lord without prior sacramental confession unless a grave reason is present and there is no opportunity of confessing; in this case the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible" (CIC 916).

The requirement for sacramental confession can be dispensed if four conditions are fulfilled: (1) there must be a grave reason to receive Communion (for example, danger of death), (2) it must be physically or morally impossible to go to confession first, (3) the person must already be in a state of grace through perfect contrition, and (4) he must resolve to go to confession as soon as possible.






### **MQOF COVID-19 SAFETY** PLAN KEY POINTS

Commencing 23rd October 2020

- With the announcement of new restrictions commencing Friday, 23rd October, we are allowed to have 250 at St Patrick's Church and 90 for St Michael's Church at any one time, excluding the clergy and those involved in the liturgy. For contact tracing: BOOKING IS STILL NECESSARY via Online or by contacting the Parish Office during office hours.
- You are required to confirm your name on the registration sheet. If you haven't made a booking, you will be asked to provide your name and a contact number for contact tracing purposes as mandated by the NSW Government.
- No congregational singing should occur
- Face masks are still strongly encouraged
- On arrival at the church, please sanitize your hands using the sanitizer supplied at the foyer.
- Please sit on the designated chairs. However, if you are from the same family group, you are allowed to sit together.
- During Communion, please form one line and you are required to maintain physical distancing at all times.
- At the conclusion of Mass, please disinfect the chair you used before leaving with the disinfecting wipes provided at the church foyer.
- You are requested not to socialize inside or outside the church but leave as soon as possible after Mass.
- You are not allowed to enter the church if you are experiencing cold or flu-like symptoms, have a temperature, been in contact with anyone that is either a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19 even if you have made a Mass booking.
- We understand the inconvenience the above may pose, but the health of our parishioners and the wider community is our highest concern.
