This week students are back in schools and so it is fitting that the Gospel this Sunday focuses on teaching. Jesus is presented as eager to teach – he goes to teach in the synagogue as soon as the sabbath came. He is also presented as a good teacher – he teaches with authority, unlike the scribes.

Yet a necessary part of the activity of teaching is the one receiving the teaching – the student – and St. Mark contrasts two different types of students, or two different ways to respond to teaching. The first is from those in the synagogue hearing Jesus teach. St. Mark says that Jesus' teaching 'made a deep impression on them'. This tells us straight away that they responded to Jesus' teaching with an open heart i.e. they were ready and willing to receive his teaching. In other words, they were teachable; they were willing to be taught by Jesus and relished his teaching. The fact that St. Mark presents them as silent, as uttering no words, is a further clue to this. It is as if they were silently listening to the teaching of Jesus.

This is in stark contrast to the unclean spirit, or the demon that has possessed the man. The demon is not silent; the demon speaks, and speaks so much that Jesus has to silence him. I'm sure many teachers could call to mind some troublesome students that they too have had to silence, and how hard it is to teach such students. It is no different for Jesus. The demon is not willing to be taught; instead, he tries to teach Jesus: 'I know who you are...' This is the other type of student: one unwilling to be taught; someone who is unteachable; someone too proud or stubborn to be taught.

We might think that because we already believe in Jesus we don't have to worry too much about this because we have already received Jesus' teaching. But we should not be so complacent. Jesus is still teaching us, long after we come to believe in him; he is still forming us, moulding us, correcting us. And so, all of us are presented with these paths: will we be like those in the synagogue, those who receive Jesus' teaching with open hearts, those who are teachable; or will we be like the demon, someone whose heart is closed, someone who is unteachable?

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

SACRED SCRIPTURE

I. CHRIST - THE UNIQUE WORD OF SACRED SCRIPTURE

101 In order to reveal himself to men, in the condescension of his goodness God speaks to them in human words: "Indeed the words of God, expressed in the words of men, are in every way like human language, just as the Word of the eternal Father, when he took on himself the flesh of human weakness, became like men."

103 For this reason, the Church has always venerated the Scriptures as she venerates the Lord's Body. She never ceases to present to the faithful the bread of life, taken from the one table of God's Word and Christ's Body.

104 In Sacred Scripture, the Church constantly finds her nourishment and her strength, for she welcomes it not as a human word, "but as what it really is, the word of God". "In the sacred books, the Father who is in heaven comes lovingly to meet his children, and talks with them."

II. INSPIRATION AND TRUTH OF SACRED SCRIPTURE

105 *God is the author of Sacred Scripture.* "The divinely revealed realities, which are contained and presented in the text of Sacred Scripture, have been written down under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit."

"For Holy Mother Church, relying on the faith of the apostolic age, accepts as sacred and canonical the books of the Old and the New Testaments, whole and entire, with all their parts, on the grounds that, written under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, they have God as their author, and have been handed on as such to the Church herself."

106 God inspired the human authors of the sacred books. "To compose the sacred books, God chose certain men who, all the while he employed them in this task, made full use of their own faculties and powers so that, though he acted in them and by them, it was as true authors that they consigned to writing whatever he wanted written, and no more."

107 The inspired books teach the truth. "Since therefore all that the inspired authors or sacred writers affirm should be regarded as affirmed by the Holy Spirit, we must acknowledge that the books of Scripture firmly, faithfully, and without error teach that truth which God, for the sake of our salvation, wished to see confided to the Sacred Scriptures."

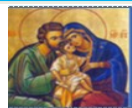

COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES COMMENCING 29th of January 2021

- With the announcement of new restrictions effective 29th of January 2021, we are back to the 4 square meter rule. Therefore we are allowed to have **250 people in St Patrick's church** and **90 people at St Michael's church** at any one time, excluding the clergy and those involved in the liturgy. Therefore, **BOOKING IS NECESSARY!**
- **Wearing FACE MASKS is now MANDATORY** at places of worship, non-compliance will attract a \$200 on the spot-fine for individuals. Children under 12 are exempt but are encouraged to wear masks where practicable.
- Congregational singing is **NOT PERMITTED**.
- The 1.5-meter social distancing per household still applies.
- NSW Government still requires **CONTACT TRACING**, there are two ways to do this:
 1. Mass Attendance Slips **MUST** be completed by each household per mass. Slips are available in the church foyers. Feel free to take home a few slips so you can complete them before going to church to avoid delay. Drop the completed card on the day you are attending in the designated box provided in the foyer
 2. Online Booking is available. To register, go to: <https://mqofblacktown.org.au>, registration will close at midday on Friday, if you need assistance, please ring the parish office during office hours (9am to 4pm Mon to Thu and 12pm Fri)
- The elderly, those with health conditions, flu-like symptoms and low-immune system are still advised to stay at home. Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.
- You are required to sanitise your hands on arrival at the church and disinfect your chair after the Mass. Sanitizer and wipes are provided at the church foyers.
