Christ's Healing Touch

The experience of the leper touched and healed by Jesus in the Gospel (Mark 1:40-45) continues to speak to those who seek and know Jesus and put their faith and trust in Him. The healing of the leper reveals who Jesus is because in the Scriptures no one heals a leper but God alone. Consider the Old Testament story of Naaman, the Syrian who went to the king of Israel that the prophet Elisha might heal him. The king's words "Am I God...that this man sends word to me to cure a man of his leprosy? (2 Kings 5:7). The assumption therefore is that only God can cure leprosy. So what Jesus did in our gospel today tells us that he is divine, that he is God.

Leprosy is not common in our time. But I had the chance in 2015 to visit a colony of lepers in Calcutta, India. The place is isolated and those who were there were almost forgotten by their loved ones. Imagine the impact of isolation and rejection. This reminds me of the leper in the gospel who came to Jesus and kneeling begged him to make him clean, to heal him. No one would ever come close to the leper and more so touch him because they can be contaminated. Not in Jesus' case. The one who is perfectly pure and holy is the only one who can reverse the effects of leprosy, who can restore once again the wound of isolation. The leper can once again be part of the community and worship God in the Temple.

The spiritual writers have always seen in the Old Testament conception of leprosy as a symbol of sin. In many ways it disfigures our souls and eventually alienates us not only from others and God but even with our selves. It is therefore important not to allow our pride and other sins to grow and spread like a spiritual forest fire. When Jesus reaches out and touches the leper after his supplication, "If you will, you can make me clean," and heals him, he demonstrates more than just another miracle. He reveals his entire mission. He comes to us, died on the cross to save us and cleanse us from our sins. He comes to touch our lives with his compassion and love, so we can experience the fullness of life. This is the true foundation of our mission. We can only share the compassion of Jesus with others when we have experienced it ourselves.

'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.

III. THE HOLY SPIRIT, INTERPRETER OF SCRIPTURE

The senses of Scripture

- 115 According to an ancient tradition, one can distinguish between two senses of Scripture: the literal and the spiritual, the latter being subdivided into the allegorical, moral and anagogical senses. The profound concordance of the four senses guarantees all its richness to the living reading of Scripture in the Church.
- 116 The literal sense is the meaning conveyed by the words of Scripture and discovered by exegesis, following the rules of sound interpretation: "All other senses of Sacred Scripture are based on the literal."83
- 117 The spiritual sense. Thanks to the unity of God's plan, not only the text of Scripture but also the realities and events about which it speaks can be signs.
- 1. The allegorical sense. We can acquire a more profound understanding of events by recognizing their significance in Christ; thus the crossing of the Red Sea is a sign or type of Christ's victory and also of Christian Baptism.84
- 2. The moral sense. The events reported in Scripture ought to lead us to act justly. As St. Paul says, they were written "for our instruction".85
- 3. The anagogical sense (Greek: anagoge, "leading"). We can view realities and events in terms of their eternal significance, leading us toward our true homeland: thus the Church on earth is a sign of the heavenly Jerusalem.86
- 118 A medieval couplet summarizes the significance of the four senses:

The Letter speaks of deeds; Allegory to faith;

The Moral how to act; Anagogy our destiny. 87

119 "It is the task of exegetes to work, according to these rules, towards a better understanding and explanation of the meaning of Sacred Scripture in order that their research may help the Church to form a firmer judgement. For, of course, all that has been said about the manner of interpreting Scripture is ultimately subject to the judgement of the Church which exercises the divinely conferred commission and ministry of watching over and interpreting the Word of God." 88

But I would not believe in the Gospel, had not the authority of the Catholic Church already moved me.89

COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES COMMENCING 12th of February 2021

• With the announcement of new restrictions effective 12th of February 2021, we are back to the 2 square meter rule. Therefore we are allowed to have **500 people in St Patrick's** church and **180 people at St Michael's church** at any one time, excluding the clergy and those involved in the liturgy.

BOOKING IS NECESSARY!

- Wearing FACE MASKS is highly recommended at places of worship.
- Congregational singing is **NOT PERMITTED.**
- The 1.5-meter social distancing still applies.
- NSW Government still requires **CONTACT TRACING**, there are two ways to do this:
- 1. Mass Attendance Slips MUST be completed by each household per mass. Slips are available in the church foyers. Feel free to take home a few slips so you can complete them before going to church to avoid delay. Drop the completed card on the day you are attending in the designated box provided in the foyer
- 2. Online Booking is available. To register, go to: https://mqofblacktown.org.au, registration will close at midday on Friday, if you need assistance, please ring the parish office during office hours (9am to 4pm Mon to Thu and 12pm Fri)
- The elderly, those with health conditions, flulike symptoms and low-immune system are still advised to stay at home. Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.
- You are required to sanitise your hands on arrival at the church and disinfect your chair after the Mass. Sanitizer and wipes are provided at the church foyers.

The MQOF Social Justice Group is holding a collection for the House of Welcome in these challenging times and would like to ask for the generosity of the community to support this cause.


Items needed are listed below. The collection drive is on the weekends of 20^{th} and 21^{st} February and 27^{th} and 28^{th} February.
