OUR MISSION STATEMENT

Mary, Queen of the Family Parish is a welcoming, diverse, multicultural, Catholic community.

We seek: to live, teach and share the joy of the Gospel; to grow as disciples of Jesus through prayer, witness and action and to respond to the needs of the family in the Blacktown community and beyond.



Last week we went out into the desert with Jesus; this week we climb the mountain. Last week we went into the isolation of the desert; this week we climb the mountain surrounded by saints, Peter and James and John. In all this, we are presented with the full gamut of the Christian life.

Yes, there are moments where we want to cry out with Peter: 'It is wonderful for us to be here'! We feel on fire for the Lord; we love our faith; we feel close to God. But there are times too when we feel as dry as a desert. There are times when we can almost hear God audibly, that's how close he seems; and there are times when the only voice we seem to hear is the voice of the Tempter: Satan. The first are moments of consolation; the second, moments of desolation.

All of this is the Christian life. There is no selecting one or the other. There is no preferring one to the other, as if that will make a difference. All of us, if we are seriously trying to grow in our faith spend time in the desert and on the mountain, time in desolation and in consolation. It's just going to happen.

The basic fact for us to keep before us, though, is that Jesus Christ is there in the desert and he is there on the mountain. We get ourselves into all sorts of problems when we forget that and think he is only in one place and not the other. Typically, we do this when we are in the desert, when we are going through some desolation and we tell ourselves that Jesus must not be there; he is on the mountain where it is wonderful to be. So we tell ourselves. But whenever we do this, whenever we forget that Jesus is with us both on the mountain and in the desert, we lose an opportunity to grow in holiness because we are looking for him elsewhere.

The saints are people who went out into the desert and went up the mountain and learnt to recognise that Jesus was there in both places, in both the moments of consolation and the moments of desolation. Perhaps this Lent, we can focus on learning to recognise Jesus in our moments of desolation just as much as our moments of consolation.

SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT - YEAR B

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Cf. Ps 26:8-9

Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ! From the shining cloud, the Father's voice is heard: this is my beloved Son, hear him. Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

GOSPEL: Mk 9:2-10

Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.

IV. THE CANON OF SCRIPTURE

The New Testament

124 "The Word of God, which is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith, is set forth and displays its power in a most wonderful way in the writings of the New Testament" which hand on the ultimate truth of God's Revelation. 125 The Gospels are the heart of all the Scriptures "because they are our principal source for the life and teaching of the Incarnate Word, our Savior". 98

126 We can distinguish three stages in the formation of the Gospels:

- 1. The life and teaching of Jesus. The Church holds firmly that the four Gospels, "whose historicity she unhesitatingly affirms, faithfully hand on what Jesus, the Son of God, while he lived among men, really did and taught for their eternal salvation, until the day when he was taken up."
- 2. *The oral tradition*. "For, after the ascension of the Lord, the apostles handed on to their hearers what he had said and done, but with that fuller understanding which they, instructed by the glorious events of Christ and enlightened by the Spirit of truth, now enjoyed." ¹⁰⁰
- 3. *The written Gospels*. "The sacred authors, in writing the four Gospels, selected certain of the many elements which had been handed on, either orally or already in written form; others they synthesized or explained with an eye to the situation of the churches, the while sustaining the form of preaching, but always in such a fashion that they have told us the honest truth about Jesus." ¹⁰¹

<u>127</u> The fourfold Gospel holds a unique place in the Church, as is evident both in the veneration which the liturgy accords it and in the surpassing attraction it has exercised on the saints at all times:

There is no doctrine which could be better, more precious and more splendid than the text of the Gospel. Behold and retain what our Lord and Master, Christ, has taught by his words and accomplished by his deeds. 102

But above all it's the gospels that occupy my mind when I'm at prayer; my poor soul has so many needs, and yet this is the one thing needful. I'm always finding fresh lights there; hidden meanings which had meant nothing to me hitherto. 103

COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES COMMENCING 12th of February 2021

• With the announcement of new restrictions effective 12th of February 2021, we are back to the 2 square meter rule. Therefore we are allowed to have **500 people in St Patrick's** church and **180 people at St Michael's church** at any one time, excluding the clergy and those involved in the liturgy.

BOOKING IS NECESSARY!

- Wearing FACE MASKS is highly recommended at places of worship.
- Congregational singing is **NOT PERMITTED.**
- The 1.5-meter social distancing still applies.
- NSW Government still requires **CONTACT TRACING**, there are two ways to do this:
- 1. Mass Attendance Slips MUST be completed by each household per mass. Slips are available in the church foyers. Feel free to take home a few slips so you can complete them before going to church to avoid delay. Drop the completed card on the day you are attending in the designated box provided in the foyer
- 2. Online Booking is available. To register, go to: https://mqofblacktown.org.au, registration will close at midday on Friday, if you need assistance, please ring the parish office during office hours (9am to 4pm Mon to Thu and 12pm Fri)
- The elderly, those with health conditions, flu-like symptoms and low-immune system are still advised to stay at home. Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.
- You are required to sanitise your hands on arrival at the church and disinfect your chair after the Mass. Sanitizer and wipes are provided at the church foyers.

Below are our Sacrament dates for 2021. At the moment we only have the preparation dates for our First Eucharist sacramental process.





Legion of Mary



The Legion of Mary was founded in Dublin, Ireland on 7th September 1921.

It is a lay Catholic organization whose members are giving service to the church on a voluntary basis in almost every country.

The objective of the Legion of Mary is the glory of God through the holiness of its members developed by prayer and active cooperation in Mary's and the Church's work.

The unit of the legion of Mary is called a presidium, which holds a weekly meeting, which consists of prayer, reports and discussions. Persons who wish to join the Legion must apply for membership in a Praesidium.

The works of the Legion - Active membership

The legion sees as its priority the spiritual and social welfare of each individual. The members participate in the life of the parish through visitation of families, the sick, both in their homes and in hospitals and through collaboration in every apostolic and missionary undertaking sponsored by the parish. Every legionary is required to carry out a weekly apostolic work in the spirit of faith and in union with Mary.

For all states of the laity the perfect example of spiritual and apostolic life is the most Blessed Virgin Mary, Queen of Apostles, who while leading the life common to all here on earth, one filled with family concerns and labors, was always intimately united with her Son and in an entirely unique way cooperated in the work of the Savior. All should devoutly venerate her and commend their life and apostolate to her maternal care.

Auxiliary membership

This membership is open to Priests, Religious and lay people who wish to associate themselves with the Legion by undertaking a service of prayer in its name.

Pope John Paul II now St John Paul II made the following address to Italian Legionaries

"Yours is an eminently Marian spirituality, not only because the legion glories in carrying Mary's name as its unfurled banner, but above all becomes its basis, its methods of spirituality and apostolate on the dynamic principle of union with Mary, on the truth of the intimate participation of the Virgin Mary in the plan of salvation. In other words, you intend to render your service to every person, who is the image of Christ with the spirit and solicitude of Mary."


