Sold Slave to Sainthood

This Sunday we celebrate the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time-Year B. Mark's Gospel continues to describe Jesus' public ministry of healing illnesses and those possessed by devils. Among those who were healed was Simon's mother-in-law whom Jesus took by the hand. We ask Jesus to take us by the hand when we are sick and troubled.

This Sunday, let us reflect on the life of Saint Josephine Bakhita. Her Feast Day is on the 8th of February each year. She was canonised on the 1st of October 2000 by Pope St John Paul II. Pope Francis named her the Patron Saint of Victims of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking. Every year, Catholics are asked and encouraged to pray, reflect and act for all those affected by the crimes of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking.

St Bakhita was kidnapped by the Arabs Slave Traders as a child of nine years old and sold three times, one after another into slavery in Sudan. She forgot her birth name, but the kidnappers gave her name Bakhita, meaning "Fortunate." At last, she was sold to an Italian consul in 1882. The consul took her to Italy. Bakhita's life was changed when she was treated with love. As she grew older, and after long painful years of sickness, she had a great hope. She was assigned later on to the Canossian Sisters.

Her hope became alive for over fifty years until her death in Schio (Vicenza) in 1947. She spent her entire life witnessing God's grace and love as a nun of the Daughters of Charity through cooking, sewing, embroidery and attending to the poor. The Italians called her "Our Black."

St Bakhita helped by the grace of God is a witness of hope. She is the bearer of the Gospel of Christ especially to people affected by the act of crimes of modern slavery and human trafficking. When performing her duty, she talked to children with a kind voice pleasing to the little ones. She returned evil with good. She had comforted the poor and encouraged the suffering.

St Bakhita experienced terrible days of her slavery more than once. In her final days, she begged the nurse who assisted her, "Please, loosen the chain... they are heavy." As we pray during her Feast Day on 8 February, may her lowly and helpless life story inspire hope to those experiencing injustices and the many victims of slavery and human exploitation. Amen.

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway. He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them.

That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was.

In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there. Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.

Catechism of the Catholic Church

III. THE HOLY SPIRIT, INTERPRETER OF SCRIPTURE

109 In Sacred Scripture, God speaks to man in a human way. To interpret Scripture correctly, the reader must be attentive to what the human authors truly wanted to affirm, and to what God wanted to reveal to us by their words.

110 In order to discover *the sacred authors' intention*, the reader must take into account the conditions of their time and culture, the literary genres in use at that time, and the modes of feeling, speaking and narrating then current. "For the fact is that truth is differently presented and expressed in the various types of historical writing, in prophetic and poetical texts, and in other forms of literary expression."

111 But since Sacred Scripture is inspired, there is another and no less important principle of correct interpretation, without which Scripture would remain a dead letter. "Sacred Scripture must be read and interpreted in the light of the same Spirit by whom it was written."

The Second Vatican Council indicates three criteria for interpreting Scripture in accordance with the Spirit who inspired it.

112 1. *Be especially attentive "to the content and unity of the whole Scripture"*. Different as the books which compose it may be, Scripture is a unity by reason of the unity of God's plan, of which Christ Jesus is the center and heart, open since his Passover.

The phrase "heart of Christ" can refer to Sacred Scripture, which makes known his heart, closed before the Passion, as the Scripture was obscure. But the Scripture has been opened since the Passion; since those who from then on have understood it, consider and discern in what way the prophecies must be interpreted.

113 2. *Read the Scripture within "the living Tradition of the whole Church"*. According to a saying of the Fathers, Sacred Scripture is written principally in the Church's heart rather than in documents and records, for the Church carries in her Tradition the living memorial of God's Word, and it is the Holy Spirit who gives her the spiritual interpretation of the Scripture ("... according to the spiritual meaning which the Spirit grants to the Church").

114 3. *Be attentive to the analogy of faith*. By "analogy of faith" we mean the coherence of the truths of faith among themselves and within the whole plan of Revelation.

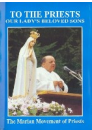

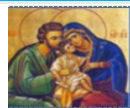

COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES COMMENCING 29th of January 2021

- With the announcement of new restrictions effective 29th of January 2021, we are back to the 4 square meter rule. Therefore we are allowed to have **250 people in St Patrick's church** and **90 people at St Michael's church** at any one time, excluding the clergy and those involved in the liturgy. Therefore, **BOOKING IS NECESSARY!**
- **Wearing FACE MASKS is now MANDATORY** at places of worship, non-compliance will attract a \$200 on the spot-fine for individuals. Children under 12 are exempt but are encouraged to wear masks where practicable.
- Congregational singing is **NOT PERMITTED**.
- The 1.5-meter social distancing per household still applies.
- NSW Government still requires **CONTACT TRACING**, there are two ways to do this:
 1. Mass Attendance Slips **MUST** be completed by each household per mass. Slips are available in the church foyers. Feel free to take home a few slips so you can complete them before going to church to avoid delay. Drop the completed card on the day you are attending in the designated box provided in the foyer
 2. Online Booking is available. To register, go to: <https://mqofblacktown.org.au>, registration will close at midday on Friday, if you need assistance, please ring the parish office during office hours (9am to 4pm Mon to Thu and 12pm Fri)
- The elderly, those with health conditions, flu-like symptoms and low-immune system are still advised to stay at home. Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.
- You are required to sanitise your hands on arrival at the church and disinfect your chair after the Mass. Sanitizer and wipes are provided at the church foyers.

We sincerely thank you for understanding, and for playing your part in keeping our community safe.

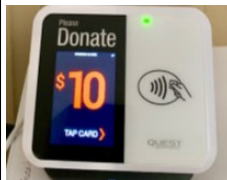

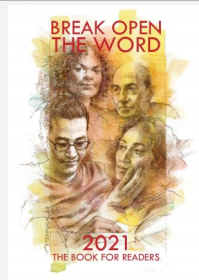
TAP & GO MACHINE

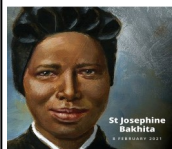

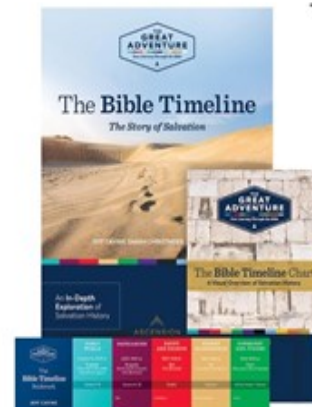

Using a unique color-coded chart, you will learn the major people, places, and events of the Bible and discover how they all come together to reveal the remarkable story of our faith.

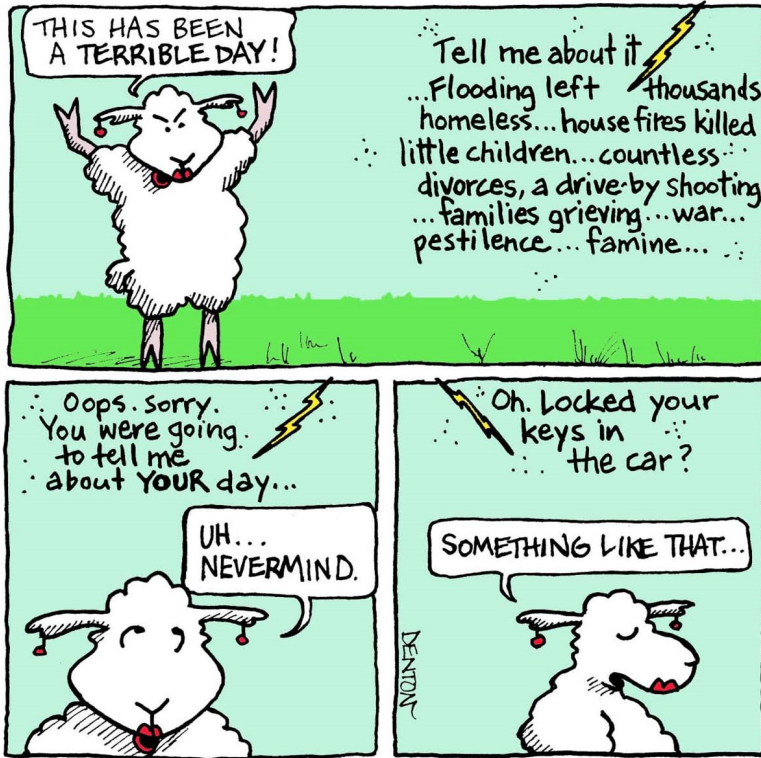

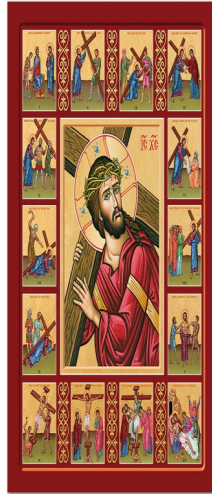

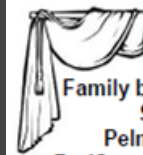
