The Cross of Christ: A Sign of God's Love

What do we see when we look at the Crucified Christ? St Paul tells us that Christ crucified is "a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God" (1 Corinthians 1:23-24). Everyone is invited to enter into the depth of the mystery of the cross and find salvation in it. This is indeed good news, that we are saved by God this way so that we may see his love that can never be measured by human standards. St Thomas Aquinas asserts that there was no other more suitable way of healing our misery than by the Passion of Christ (ST 3.46.4).

Jesus brought into fulfilment what has been foreshadowed in the Old Testament Scriptures. "As Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life" (John 3:14). This is the opening text of our Gospel this Sunday. We must recall the story of rebellious Israelites in Numbers 21. After they have been bitten by the poisonous serpents, they were healed by looking at the bronze serpent Moses mounted on a pole. "Jesus sees this relic as an image of his own Crucifixion and the healing it will bring to a rebellious world" (CCC 2130).

The cross is God's way of loving and saving us. So why do we turn away from the cross of Christ? Why don't we meditate on the love of God he manifested by giving us his onlybegotten Son? Love finds its true meaning on the cross. It is a divine and sacrificial love that can transform our self-focused "love" always seeking for comfort. Through it, we can understand that our suffering is not really bad at all when we unite it with the suffering of Christ and transform it as a self-offering for the sake of love of God and others.

The lifting up of Jesus on the cross does not only point to his death but also to his resurrection, so that he may draw humanity to himself. He triumphs over darkness and death and gives us hope to live in the light. May we truly believe in him and show it in words and actions as a response to God's offer of salvation. "For God sent the Son into the world, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him" (John 3"17). May we continue to gaze and ponder on the Crucified Christ and ask the grace to experience his love for us.

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Cf. Is 66:10-11

Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast.

FIRST READING: 2 CHR 36:14-16. 19-23

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 136. R. V.6 Let my tongue be silenced, if ever I forget you!

SECOND READING: EPH 2:4-10

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Jn 3:16

Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ! God loved the world so much, he gave us his only Son, that all who believe in him might have eternal life. Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

GOSPEL: Jn 3:14-21

Jesus said to Nicodemus:

The Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him. Yes, God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life.

For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved. No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son.

On these grounds is sentence pronounced: that though the light has come into the world men have shown they prefer darkness to the Light because their deeds were evil.

And indeed, everybody who does wrong hates the light and avoids it, for fear his actions should be exposed; but the man who lives by the truth comes out into the light, so that it may be plainly seen that what he does is done in God.'

Catechism of the Catholic Church

V. SACRED SCRIPTURE IN THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH

IN BRIEF

134 All Sacred Scripture is but one book, and this one book is Christ, "because all divine Scripture speaks of Christ, and all divine Scripture is fulfilled in Christ" (Hugh of St. Victor, De arca Noe 2,8:PL 176,642: cf. ibid. 2,9:PL 176,642-643).

135 "The Sacred Scriptures contain the Word of God and, because they are inspired, they are truly the Word of God" (DV 24).

136 God is the author of Sacred Scripture because he inspired its human authors; he acts in them and by means of them. He thus gives assurance that their writings teach without error his saving truth (cf. DV 11).

137 Interpretation of the inspired Scripture must be attentive above all to what God wants to reveal through the sacred authors for our salvation. What comes from the Spirit is not fully "understood except by the Spirit's action' (cf. Origen, Hom. in Ex. 4, 5: PG 12, 320).

138 The Church accepts and venerates as inspired the 46 books of the Old Testament and the 27 books of the New.

139 The four Gospels occupy a central place because Christ Jesus is their center.

140 The unity of the two Testaments proceeds from the unity of God's plan and his Revelation. The Old Testament prepares for the New and the New Testament fulfills the Old; the two shed light on each other; both are true Word of God.

141 "The Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures as she venerated the Body of the Lord" (DV 21): both nourish and govern the whole Christian life. "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Ps 119:105; cf. Is 50:4).


Have you thought?

Think for a moment of the last time you saw or heard a reference to God on a television program, in a song, or some other popular medium. Chances are, the reference was one of a judging, vengeful, punishing God. This sort of image plays particularly well with a modern audience. It's easier to dismiss God as irrelevant if we can paint God in that sort of image. TV sitcoms do it particularly well with thunderclaps, bolts of lightening and booming, disapproving voices from above. It's much harder to dismiss a God of love who will go to extremes to demonstrate that love.


