Thankfully, this year we too can follow Jesus into Jerusalem amidst a large crowd singing 'Hosanna!' This was not the case last year. This time last year we were sheltering in our houses, going out to get essentials only, stocking up on toilet paper. and wondering what on earth was going to happen next. We were not holding our palm branches up to be blessed, we were not processing with Jesus into the city, we were not even at church. And while we still may be wondering what on earth is going to happen next, particularly after the floods, this year we actually get to celebrate Palm Sunday properly and so we should sing 'Hosanna!'

But amidst our singing we should be careful not to follow the crowd, the crowd that welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem, too closely. They rejoiced in Jesus. This was no play-acting from them or posturing. They really were rejoicing in Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. But their joy would not last the week. Their joy in Jesus was too shallow, too hollow, too superficial.

This should be our point of departure from the crowd. We, like them, should rejoice in Jesus, in his movement and activity in us and in our life. But our joy cannot be as shallow, as hollow, as superficial as theirs. Ours cannot turn, as theirs did, to hate, to unfaithfulness; ours must last longer than the week.

And this might seem easier said than done. How can we make our joy last longer than the crowd, longer than the week? Well, one way is to ask ourselves whether we are really rejoicing in Jesus, in his person, in being united to him, or are we rejoicing in what he can do for us? That, for some of the crowd, was their point of departure: Jesus was promising a kingdom and he didn't deliver, or at least didn't deliver in the way they expected, so they left him. They actually weren't interested in the person of Jesus; they just wanted him for what he could do for them.

True and lasting joy is not found in what Jesus can do for us, at least in a superficial or material sense. It is found, rather, in Jesus himself, in knowing and loving him, in having a deep, personal relationship with him. This is what really propels us to cry out 'Hosanna!'

THE LITURGY

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD YEAR B

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Cf. Jn 12: 1, 12-13; Ps 23: 9-10

Six days before the Passover, when the Lord came into the city of Jerusalem, the children ran to meet him; in their hands they carried palm branches and with a loud voice cried out: Hosanna in the highest!

Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy!

O gates, lift high your heads; grow higher, ancient doors. Let him enter, the king of glory! Who is this king of glory? He, the Lord of hosts, he is the king of glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed are you, who have come in your abundant mercy!

FIRST READING: IS 50:4-7

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 21:8-9. 17-20. 23-24. R.

V.2

(R) My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

SECOND READING: PHIL 2:6-11

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Phil 2:8-9

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory! Christ became obedient for us even to death dying on the cross. Therefore God raised him on high and gave him a name above all other names. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory!

GOSPEL: Mk 15:1-39 (Shorter Form)

First thing in the morning, the chief priests together with the elders and the scribes, in short the whole Sanhedrin, had their plan ready. They had Jesus bound and took him away and handed him over to Pilate.


Pilate questioned him, 'Are you the king of the Jews?' 'It is you who say it' he answered. And the chief priests brought many accusations against him. Pilate questioned him again, 'Have you no reply at all? See how many accusations they are bringing against you!' But to Pilate's amazement, Jesus made no further reply.

At festival time Pilate used to release a prisoner for them, anyone they asked for. Now a man called Barabbas was then in prison with the rioters who had Committee murder during the uprising. When the crowd went up and began to ask Pilate the customary favour, Pilate answered them, 'Do you want me to release for you the king of the Jews?' For he realised it was out of jealousy that the chief priests had handed Jesus over. The chief priests, however, had Incited the crowd to demand that he should release Barabbas for them instead. Then Pilate spoke again. 'But in that case,' he said to them 'what am I to do with the man you call king of the Jews?' They shouted back, 'Crucify him!' 'Why?' Pilate asked them 'What harm has he done?' But they shouted all the louder, 'Crucify him!' So Pilate, anxious to placate the crowd, released Barabbas for them and, having ordered Jesus to be scourged, handed him over to be crucified.

The soldiers led him away to the inner part of the palace, that is, the Pratorium, and called the whole cohort together. They dressed him in purple, twisted some thorns into a crown and put it on him. And they began saluting him, 'Hail, king of the Jews!' They struck his head with a reed and spat on him; and they went down on their knees to do him homage. And when they had finished making fun of him, they took off the purple and dressed him in his own clothes.

They led him out to crucify him. They enlisted a passer-by, Simon of Cyrene, father of Alexander and Rufus, who was coming in from the country, to carry his cross. They brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha, which means the place of the skull. They offered him wine mixed with myrrh, but he refused it. Then they crucified him, and shared out his clothing, casting lots to decide what each should get. It was the third hour when they crucified him. The inscription giving the charge against him read: 'The King of the Jews.' And they crucified two robbers with him, one on his right and one on his left.

The passers-by jeered at him; they shook their heads and said, 'Aha! So you would destroy the Temple and rebuild it in three days! Then save yourself: come down from the cross!' The chief priests and the scribes mocked him



When the sixth hour came there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. And at the ninth hour Jesus cried out in a loud voice, 'Eloi, Eloi, Iama sabachthani?' which means, 'My God, my God, why have you deserted me?' When some of those who stood by heard this they said, 'Listen, he is calling on Elijah'. Someone ran and soaked a sponge in vinegar and, putting it on a reed, gave it him to drink saying, 'Wait and see if Elijah will come to take him down.' But Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last.

All kneel and pause a moment.

And the veil of the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom. The centurion, who was standing in front of him, had seen how he had died, and he said, 'In truth this man was a son of God.'

Catechism of the Catholic Church

The Profession of Faith (Part One) ARTICLE 4 - "JESUS CHRIST SUFFERED UNDER PONTIUS PILATE, WAS CRUCIFIED, DIED, AND WAS BURIED"

Paragraph 1. Jesus and Israel

- **574.** From the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, certain Pharisees and partisans of Herod together with priests and scribes agreed together to destroy him.317 Because of certain acts of his expelling demons, forgiving sins, healing on the sabbath day, his novel interpretation of the precepts of the Law regarding purity, and his familiarity with tax collectors and public sinners.318 -- some ill-intentioned persons suspected Jesus of demonic possession.319 He is accused of blasphemy and false prophecy, religious crimes which the Law punished with death by stoning.320
- **575.** Many of Jesus' deeds and words constituted a "sign of contradiction",321 but more so for the religious authorities in Jerusalem, whom the Gospel according to John often calls simply "the Jews",322 than for the ordinary People of God.323 To be sure, Christ's relations with the Pharisees were not exclusively polemical. Some Pharisees warn him of the danger he was courting;324 Jesus praises some of them, like the scribe of Mark 12:34, and dines several times at their homes.325 Jesus endorses some of the teachings imparted by this religious elite of God's people: the resurrection of the dead,326 certain forms of piety (almsgiving, fasting and prayer),327 the custom of addressing God as Father, and the centrality of the commandment to love God and neighbor.328
- **576.** In the eyes of many in Israel, Jesus seems to be acting against essential institutions of the Chosen People:
- submission to the whole of the Law in its written commandments and, for the Pharisees, in the interpretation of oral tradition;
- the centrality of the Temple at Jerusalem as the holy place where God's presence dwells in a special way;
- faith in the one God whose glory no man can share.

COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES



With the announcement of the easing of restrictions commencing Friday 27th March 2021, we are still limited by the 2 square metre rule. However, the 1.5 metre social distancing from one household to another is still in place.

The wearing of face mask is strongly encouraged if social distancing is not possible. There will be no restrictions on choirs and congregational singing in places of worship.

CONTACT TRACING:

Because NSW Government still requires contact tracing, we are implementing three ways to do this:

- Sign-in using the QR Code displayed near the entrance doors.
- Mass Attendance Slips MUST be completed by each household per mass. Slips are available in the fover.
- **Online booking** via Calendly. To register, go to: https://mqofblacktown.org.au, registration will close midnoon of every Friday.

To maximise the use of our liturgical space, please observe the following:

- 1. Families and those living under one household sit together.
- 2. Proceed to end of row if vacant.
- 3. Leave 3 chairs empty between you and another household.
- The elderly, those with health conditions, flulike symptoms and low-immune system are still advised to stay at home. Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.
- You are required to sanitise your hands on arrival at the church and disinfect your chair after the Mass. Sanitizer and wipes are provided at the church foyers.




