"Come to the Mercy of God"

strives to live as a faithful and committed "Humanity will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy." These words of Jesus to St Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938) invites us to experience more deeply the gift of God's mercy offered to all. This "Feast of Mercy," the Divine Mercy Sunday brings us the grace of being reassured again that when we trust the mercy of God. welcome his love in our lives, he will overcome for us our fears, and lifts us out from the darkness of sin and death. Peace is the gift of the risen Christ to his disciples when he appeared to them "on the evening of that first day of the week." "Peace be with you," he said and breathed on them the Holy Spirit. (Gospel- John 20:19-31).

> The Holy Spirit helps us to know the truth of God. Jesus said, "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you in all truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come" (John 16:13). When we open ourselves to the work of the Holy Spirit and constantly ask for his presence in our lives, we begin to look at things in the light of God's mystery revealed in humanity. The passion, death and resurrection of Jesus will truly come alive in our personal lives and in the Church. We would see the fulfillment of the Scriptures in the life of Jesus and God's plan of salvation to those who turn to him and seek for his mercy.

> The weakness of Thomas when he doubted that Jesus is risen, teaches us a lesson of faith today. Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and believed." Our faith in the risen Christ impels us to love God and others, and obey God's commandments (Second Reading-1 John 5:1-6). It opens our hearts to make ourselves available to be used as God's instruments to extend his love especially to those who are needy and poor (First Reading- Acts 4:32-35). When Jesus breathed on his disciples, he empowered them to become missionaries and bring the Good News to others, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." May we who have received the gift of the Holy Spirit in baptism and confirmation, will allow the mercy and love of God to grow in our lives.

THE LITURGY SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: 1 Pt 2:2

Like newborn infants, you must long for the pure, spiritual milk, that in him you may grow to salvation, alleluia.

FIRST READING: ACTS 4:32-35

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 117:2-4. 15-18. 22-24. R. V.1 (R) Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting.

SECOND READING: 1 JN 5:1-6

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Jn 20:29

Alleluia, alleluia! You believe in me, Thomas, because you have seen me; happy are those who have not seen me, but still believe! Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Jn 20:19-31

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.'

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with Them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him: 'You believe because you can see me.

Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'
There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, But they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you May believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: Cf. Jn 20:27

Bring your hand and feel the place of the nails, and do not be unbelieving but believing, alleluia.

CHAPTER TWO

I BELIEVE IN JESUS CHRIST, THE ONLY SON OF GOD

ARTICLE 5 -

"HE DESCENDED INTO HELL. ON THE THIRD DAY HE ROSE AGAIN"

Paragraph 2.

The appearances of the Risen One

641 Mary Magdalene and the holy women who came to finish anointing the body of Jesus, which had been buried in haste because the Sabbath began on the evening of Good Friday, were the first to encounter the Risen One.498 Thus the women were the first messengers of Christ's Resurrection for the apostles themselves.499 They were the next to whom Jesus appears: first Peter, then the Twelve. Peter had been called to strengthen the faith of his brothers,500 and so sees the Risen One before them; it is on the basis of his testimony that the community exclaims: "The Lord has risen indeed, and has appeared to Simon!"501

642 Everything that happened during those Paschal days involves each of the apostles - and Peter in particular - in the building of the new era begun on Easter morning. As witnesses of the Risen One, they remain the foundation stones of his Church. The faith of the first community of believers is based on the witness of concrete men known to the Christians and for the most part still living among them. Peter and the Twelve are the primary "witnesses to his Resurrection", but they are not the only ones - Paul speaks clearly of more than five hundred persons to whom Jesus appeared on a single occasion and also of James and of all the apostles.502

643 Given all these testimonies, Christ's Resurrection cannot be interpreted as something outside the physical order, and it is impossible not to acknowledge it as an historical fact. It is clear from the facts that the disciples' faith was drastically put to the test by their master's Passion and death on the cross, which he had foretold.503 The shock provoked by the Passion was so great that at least some of the disciples did not at once believe in the news of the Resurrection. Far from showing us a community seized by a mystical exaltation, the Gospels present us with disciples demoralized ("looking sad"504) and frightened. For they had not believed the holy women returning from the tomb and had regarded their words as an "idle tale".505 When Jesus reveals himself to the Eleven on Easter evening, "he upbraided them for their unbelief and hardness of heart, because they had not believed those who saw him after he had risen."506

644 Even when faced with the reality of the risen Jesus the disciples are still doubtful, so impossible did the thing seem: they thought they were seeing a ghost. "In their joy they were still disbelieving and still wondering." 507 Thomas will also experience the test of doubt and St. Matthew relates that during the risen Lord's last appearance in Galilee "some doubted." 508 Therefore the hypothesis that the Resurrection was produced by the apostles' faith (or credulity) will not hold up. On the contrary their faith in the Resurrection was born, under the action of divine grace, from their direct experience of the reality of the risen Jesus.

COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES



With the announcement of the easing of restrictions commencing Friday 27th March 2021, we are still limited by the 2 square metre rule. However, the 1.5 metre social distancing from one household to another is still in place.

The wearing of face mask is strongly encouraged if social distancing is not possible. There will be no restrictions on choirs and congregational singing in places of worship.

CONTACT TRACING:

Because NSW Government still requires contact tracing, we are implementing three ways to do this:

- Sign-in using the QR Code displayed near the entrance doors.
- Mass Attendance Slips MUST be completed by each household per mass. Slips are available in the foyer.
- Online booking via Calendly. To register, go to: https://mqofblacktown.org.au, registration will close midnoon of every Friday.

To maximise the use of our liturgical space, please observe the following:

- Families and those living under one household sit together.
- 2. Proceed to end of row if vacant.
- 3. Leave 3 chairs empty between you and another household.
- The elderly, those with health conditions, flulike symptoms and low-immune system are still advised to stay at home. Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.
- You are required to sanitise your hands on arrival at the church and disinfect your chair after the Mass. Sanitizer and wipes are provided at the church foyers.


