Gratitude for the Word of God

I attended the last seven weeks Bible study program "The Bible Timeline" which will continue for 24 weeks in our parish and has brought parishioners together for the detail guide journey through salvation history.

To me the Scriptures are the Word of God, gifts for us that gives purpose, meaning and understanding in our lives. When I read and listen to them, they always are a source of inspiration, comfort and hope to me. Our gratitude for the Word of God means so much to us as Christians when we listen, read and take part in it, giving us strength and consolation.

This Third Sunday of Easter from the Gospel of Luke teaches us how Jesus tells his disciples to interpret the Scriptures. It was Jesus' own words to his disciples that they should know everything written in the Old Testament is referred to him. For them to understand the Scriptures, he turns to the Old Testament in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms that said about the Messiah was to come and what would happen to him. From that moment they understood all the promises have been fulfilled in his Passion, Death and Resurrection. Jesus Christ opens their minds to understand the Scriptures foretell that he would suffer and on the third day he will rise from the dead. Jesus tells the disciples that he is sending them on the Mission of the Church to be his witnesses, to preach forgiveness of sins to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. We have also read in the First Reading and Epistle the beginning of the mission. Peter shows how the messianic prophecies have been fulfilled in the crucified and risen Jesus and challenges the Jews to repent and turn toward God so that their sins may be wiped out. And John's Epistle gives more answer to the doubts of early Christians advocating false doctrines, declaring the importance of Christian beliefs that Jesus' death was a sacrifice offered as redemption for our sins. John advises true Christians to approach Jesus for the forgiveness of their sins and to lead true Christian lives by obeying his commandments.

As such, listening to the Readings of this Sunday also give us our responsibility like the apostles to express our gratitude for the Word of God. We are to interpret, serve and advance the mission of the Church. We are to witness the truth about risen Jesus to touch the lives of others. Jesus calls us to be a community to share the joy of his resurrection and his words with all people. Amen.

Alleluia, alleluia! Lord Jesus, make your word plain to us: make our hearts burn with love when you speak. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Lk 24:35-48

The disciples told their story of what had

happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread.

They were still talking about all this when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you!' In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they could not believe it, and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'

CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

PART ONE THE PROFESSION OF FAITH **CHAPTER TWO** I BELIEVE IN JESUS CHRIST, THE ONLY SON OF GOD **ARTICLE 5** - "HE DESCENDED INTO HELL. ON THE THIRD DAY HE ROSE AGAIN"

Paragraph 2.

The condition of Christ's risen humanity

645 By means of touch and the sharing of a meal, the risen Jesus establishes direct contact with his disciples. He invites them in this way to recognize that he is not a ghost and above all to verify that the risen body in which he appears to them is the same body that had been tortured and crucified, for it still bears the traces of his Passion.509 Yet at the same time this authentic, real body possesses the new properties of a glorious body: not limited by space and time but able to be present how and when he wills; for Christ's humanity can no longer be confined to earth, and belongs henceforth only to the Father's divine realm.510 For this reason too the risen Jesus enjoys the sovereign freedom of appearing as he wishes: in the guise of a gardener or in other forms familiar to his disciples, precisely to awaken their faith.511

646 Christ's Resurrection was not a return to earthly life, as was the case with the raisings from the dead that he had performed before Easter: Jairus' daughter, the young man of Naim, Lazarus. These actions were miraculous events, but the persons miraculously raised returned by Jesus' power to ordinary earthly life. At some particular moment they would die again. Christ's Resurrection is essentially different. In his risen body he passes from the state of death to another life beyond time and space. At Jesus' Resurrection his body is filled with the power of the Holy Spirit: he shares the divine life in his glorious state, so that St. Paul can say that Christ is "the man of heaven".512

The Resurrection as transcendent event

647 O truly blessed Night, sings the Exultet of the Easter Vigil, which alone deserved to know the time and the hour when Christ rose from the realm of the dead!513 But no one was an eyewitness to Christ's Resurrection and no evangelist describes it. No one can say how it came about physically. Still less was its innermost essence, his passing over to another life, perceptible to the senses. Although the Resurrection was an historical event that could be verified by the sign of the empty tomb and by the reality of the apostles' encounters with the risen Christ, still it remains at the very heart of the mystery of faith as something that transcends and surpasses history. This is why the risen Christ does not reveal himself to the world, but to his disciples, "to those who came up with him from Galilee to Jerusalem, who are now his witnesses to the people."514

COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES



With the announcement of the easing of restrictions commencing Friday 27th March 2021, we are still limited by the 2 square metre rule. However, the 1.5 metre social distancing from one household to another is still in place.

The **wearing of face mask is strongly encouraged** if social distancing is not possible. There will be no restrictions on choirs and congregational singing in places of worship.

CONTACT TRACING:

Because NSW Government still requires contact tracing, we are implementing three ways to do this:

- Sign-in using the **QR Code** displayed near the entrance doors.
- Mass Attendance Slips MUST be completed by each household per mass. Slips are available in the foyer.
- Online booking via Calendly. To register, go to: https://mqofblacktown.org.au, registration will close midnoon of every Friday.

To maximise the use of our liturgical space, please observe the following:

- 1. Families and those living under one household sit together.
- 2. Proceed to end of row if vacant.

- Leave 3 chairs empty between you and another household.
- The elderly, those with health conditions, flulike symptoms and low-immune system are still advised to stay at home. Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.
- You are required to **sanitise your hands on arrival at the church and disinfect your chair** after the Mass. Sanitizer and wipes are provided at the church foyers.

We sincerely thank you for understanding, and for playing your part in keeping our community safe.




Sacramental Process for High School Students 2021


