Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

You and I are called to believe, and we receive our faith through these early witnesses—those witnesses who have encountered the risen Christ, who appeared only to his disciples. These witnesses have a sacred obligation to preach the message of conversion and salvation to all.

The Acts of the Apostles gives us the testimony of Saint Peter and ends with a very clear statement of faith: To him all the prophets bear witness, that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name. These early believers, in spite of all of their doubts about and rejections of Jesus finally acknowledge, and act in a way, that Jesus is the one chosen by God, that Jesus is the Savior and that, finally, Jesus is God.

The Letter to the Colossians begins with this affirmation: If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. In Baptism we share in the merits of Christ's Death and Resurrection. Through Baptism, we die to sin and rise to new life. If we remain united to him, we will one day rise in glory as he did. Once again, this is a clear affirmation that the early followers of Jesus had arrived at this clear Divine Truth that Jesus is Lord and Saviour.

We certainly see in the Gospel (John 20:1-9) for Easter Sunday with Peter and John running towards the empty tomb, after Mary Magdalene had run to them with the news that the Lord was no longer in the tomb! We read again, in the same Gospel, that Mary encounters Jesus outside the tomb after Peter and John had hurried off and she, in turn, runs to tell the disciples: "I have seen the Lord!" Mary was not only the first disciple to see the risen Lord, but she was a missionary disciple -a running disciple -she symbolises the Church that goes forth with a message of hope and joy!

As with the disciples, this missionary discipleship must become our own and it must become so powerful that we act out our declaration: 'Christ is risen! He is risen indeed' We know from the Scriptures that faith in the risen Christ may not immediately take away all of our defects or even keep us from all sin, but it does show us the path on which we are to walk: complete trust in the Lord Jesus and a faithful following of His teachings. Let us proclaim the message of mercy, love, peace, and justice of the risen Christ!

Have a joyful and grace-filled Easter season!

GOSPEL: Jn 20:1-9

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved Away From the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, But did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went Right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself.

Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he Saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.



CHAPTER TWO

I BELIEVE IN JESUS CHRIST, THE ONLY SON OF GOD

ARTICLE 5 - ""HE DESCENDED INTO HELL. ON THE THIRD DAY HE ROSE AGAIN"

Paragraph 2. On the Third Day He Rose from the Dead

638 "We bring you the good news that what God promised to the fathers, this day he has fulfilled to us their children by raising Jesus." 489 The Resurrection of Jesus is the crowning truth of our faith in Christ, a faith believed and lived as the central truth by the first Christian community; handed on as fundamental by Tradition; established by the documents of the New Testament; and preached as an essential part of the Paschal mystery along with the cross:

Christ is risen from the dead! Dying, he conquered death; To the dead, he has given life.490

I. THE HISTORICAL AND TRANSCENDENT EVENT

639 The mystery of Christ's resurrection is a real event, with manifestations that were historically verified, as the New Testament bears witness. In about A.D. 56 St. Paul could already write to the Corinthians: "I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the Twelve. . . "491 The Apostle speaks here of the living tradition of the Resurrection which he had learned after his conversion at the gates of Damascus.492

The empty tomb

640 "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen."493 The first element we encounter in the framework of the Easter events is the empty tomb. In itself it is not a direct proof of Resurrection; the absence of Christ's body from the tomb could be explained otherwise.494 Nonetheless the empty tomb was still an essential sign for all. Its discovery by the disciples was the first step toward recognizing the very fact of the Resurrection. This was the case, first with the holy women, and then with Peter.495 The disciple "whom Jesus loved" affirmed that when he entered the empty tomb and discovered "the linen cloths lying there", "he saw and believed".496 This suggests that he realized from the empty tomb's condition that the absence of Jesus' body could not have been of human doing and that Jesus had not simply returned to earthly life as had been the case with Lazarus.497

gospel focus

The disciple Jesus loved

In this week's gospel we see reference to a disciple as 'the one Jesus loved'. It is generally agreed that this disciple is John. There is some suggestion that the disciple, John, is in fact the John ascribed as the author of this gospel. If this is so, to describe himself as the disciple Jesus loved is merely a means of avoiding using a personal pronoun I or me. Just as Jesus described himself as 'the Son of God' or 'the Son of Man' rather than say 'I', John uses the same convention to avoid naming himself. It is not to suggest that Jesus didn't love his other disciples.

COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES



With the announcement of the easing of restrictions commencing Friday 27th March 2021, we are still limited by the 2 square metre rule. However, the 1.5 metre social distancing from one household to another is still in place.

The wearing of face mask is strongly encouraged if social distancing is not possible. There will be no restrictions on choirs and congregational singing in places of worship.

CONTACT TRACING:

Because NSW Government still requires contact tracing, we are implementing three ways to do this:

- Sign-in using the QR Code displayed near the entrance doors.
- Mass Attendance Slips MUST be completed by each household per mass. Slips are available in the fover.
- Online booking via Calendly. To register, go to: https://mqofblacktown.org.au, registration will close midnoon of every Friday.

To maximise the use of our liturgical space, please observe the following:

- 1. Families and those living under one household sit together.
- 2. Proceed to end of row if vacant.
- 3. Leave 3 chairs empty between you and another household.
- The elderly, those with health conditions, flulike symptoms and low-immune system are still advised to stay at home. Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.
- You are required to sanitise your hands on arrival at the church and disinfect your chair after the Mass. Sanitizer and wipes are provided at the church foyers.

We sincerely thank you for understanding, and for playing your part in keeping our community safe.


