Fixing our eyes to heaven

The Feast of the Ascension of the Lord recalls the 40 days of Jesus' appearance to some of his disciples after his resurrection until he was taken up to heaven in a cloud (Acts 1:1-11), and "is seated at the right hand of the Father...is seated bodily after he became incarnate and his flesh was glorified" (CCC 663). This is one of the articles of the Creed that has been professed by the early Christians and up to this time in the Catholic Church. This is a truth of antiquity. Obviously, this is quite loaded with such depth of the mystery of God. Yet, with openness to the Scriptures, humbly welcoming the teachings of the Church and the promptings of the Holy Spirit, we can truly embrace such truth as God's revelation to humanity.

"He ascended into heaven in a cloud" doesn't mean Jesus' entering into some celestial space beyond the universe. Heaven in the Scriptures can also mean invisible realm where God dwells. Indeed, the ascension of Jesus confirms his divinity where he enters into the glory of God's heavenly throne room, the invisible divine realm where God the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit is. The cloud in many ways tells us of the presence of God. For example, in Isaiah 19:1 says that "the LORD rides on in a swift cloud." Likewise, the confirmation of Jesus as the Father's beloved Son during his baptism and the transfiguration has been manifested when the heavens were opened and a voice came out of the cloud (Mark 1:10-11; Mark 9:7-8).

What does this event in the life of the Lord teach us? Why won't he just stay on earth? St Thomas Aquinas has deep insights that help us live the life of faith, hope and charity. Firstly, he said that it is more profitable for us that Jesus withdrew his bodily presence in order to increase our faith. "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe" (John 20:29). Thus, Christ wanted us to have faith in things unseen because it's greater faith. Secondly, the ascension of Jesus uplifts our hope. As Jesus entered with his glorified body into the realm of the divine- the life of the Trinity, into the invisible realm of bliss that is heaven itself, he also shows us our destiny. Our hope is to be resurrected and then to be with Christ forever in our bodies in the glorious life of the Trinity. And lastly, in order to direct the fervour of our charity to heavenly things. "Seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God" (Summa Theologica, III, 57, 1).

We can easily fall in love with earthly things and think we are made for this world and so try to find our happiness in finite things that are passing. Jesus' ascension then helps us to increase our love for the heavenly things, to fix our minds and hearts to heaven, on the life of the Trinity. He promised us to send the Holy Spirit, another Advocate, a Paraclete, to dwell in our hearts so that our faith, hope and love might be rightly ordered to our eternal destiny. In this way, we would become true disciples of Jesus who proclaim the good news to others (Mark 16:15). May this feast of the Ascension of the Lord open our hearts and minds to receive the eternal gift of God!

# CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

#### PART ONE THE PROFESSION OF FAITH CHAPTER TWO I BELIEVE IN JESUS CHRIST, THE ONLY SON OF GOD ARTICLE 6 - "HE ASCENDED INTO HEAVEN AND IS SEATED AT THE RIGHT HAND OF THE FATHER"

659 "So then the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven, and sat down at the right hand of God." 531 Christ's body was glorified at the moment of his Resurrection, as proved by the new and supernatural properties it subsequently and permanently enjoys.532 But during the forty days when he eats and drinks familiarly with his disciples and teaches them about the kingdom, his glory remains veiled under the appearance of ordinary humanity.533 Jesus' final apparition ends with the irreversible entry of his humanity into divine glory, symbolized by the cloud and by heaven, where he is seated from that time forward at God's right hand.534 Only in a wholly exceptional and unique way would Jesus show himself to Paul "as to one untimely born", in a last apparition that established him as an apostle.535

660 The veiled character of the glory of the Risen One during this time is intimated in his mysterious words to Mary Magdalene: "I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to my brethren and say to them, I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." 536 This indicates a difference in manifestation between the glory of the risen Christ and that of the Christ exalted to the Father's right hand, a transition marked by the historical and transcendent event of the Ascension.

661 This final stage stays closely linked to the first, that is, to his descent from heaven in the Incarnation. Only the one who "came from the Father" can return to the Father: Christ Jesus. 537 "No one has ascended into heaven but he who descended from heaven, the Son of man." 538 Left to its own natural powers humanity does not have access to the "Father's house", to God's life and happiness.<sub>539</sub> Only Christ can open to man such access that we, his members, might have confidence that we too shall go where he, our Head and our Source, has preceded us.540

# **COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES**



With the announcement restrictions commencing Thursday 6th My 2021, we are still limited by the 2 square metre rule. Hence we can now accommodate 500 at St Patrick's and 180 at St Michael's churches.

The wearing of face mask is mandatory for places of worship and congregational singing is not permitted. Observe 1.5 metre social distancing at all times.

### CONTACT TRACING:

Because NSW Government still requires contact tracing, we are implementing three ways to do this:

- Mass Attendance Slips MUST be completed by each household per mass. Slips are available in the foyer.
- Online booking via Calendly. To register, go to: https://mqofblacktown.org.au, registration will close midnoon of every Friday.

# To maximise the use of our liturgical space, please observe the following:

- 1. Families and those living under one household sit together.
- 2. Proceed to end of row if vacant.

- The elderly, those with health conditions, flulike symptoms and low-immune system are still advised to stay at home. Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.
- You are required to **sanitise your hands on arrival at the church and disinfect your chair** after the Mass. Sanitizer and wipes are provided at the church foyers.





# **MQOF FUNDRAISING COMMITTEE!**

Dear Parishioners,

You'd be aware that the Finance Committee (FC) has been endeavouring to form a Fundraising sub-committee (FSC) and has been calling on parishioners to volunteer. There has not been a great response to date and so, I'm taking this opportunity to explain the purpose of this sub-committee, in the hope that some of you may consider coming on board.

Whilst the PPC assists the clergy team with the spiritual nourishment of our parish, and, the FC, with the prudent financial management of our parish, the purpose of the Fundraising sub-committee would be, to foster the social aspect of our parish through events and other opportunities, whilst, at the same time, using such events as a means of raising much needed funds, for the ongoing benefit of our parish.

It would be hoped that the sub-committee could organise/run at least two social events per year to help foster a stronger community spirit, whilst at the same time, assisting with the raising of funds. The FSC would work in consultation with the FC and clergy team and, would have their total support.
