PART TWO: THE CELEBRATION OF THE CHRISTIAN MYSTERY SECTION TWO THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH CHAPTER ONE THE SACRAMENTS OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION Article 3 THE SACRAMENT OF THE EUCHARIST

IN BRIEF

1406 Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live for ever; . . . he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and . . . abides in me, and I in him" (Jn 6:51, 54, 56).

1407 The Eucharist is the heart and the summit of the Church's life, for in it Christ associates his Church and all her members with his sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving offered once for all on the cross to his Father; by this sacrifice he pours out the graces of salvation on his Body which is the Church.

1410 It is Christ himself, the eternal high priest of the New Covenant who, acting through the ministry of the priests, offers the Eucharistic sacrifice. and it is the same Christ, really present under the species of bread and wine, who is the offering of the Eucharistic sacrifice.

1418 Because Christ himself is present in the sacrament of the altar, he is to be honored with the worship of adoration. "To visit the Blessed Sacrament is . . . a proof of gratitude, an expression of love, and a duty of adoration toward Christ our Lord" (Paul VI, MF 66).

COVID-19 SAFETY GUIDELINES



With the announcement restrictions commencing Monday 17th May 2021, we are still limited by the 2 square metre rule. Hence we can now accommodate 500 at St Patrick's and 180 at St Michael's churches.

Wearing of face masks at places of worship continues to be strongly recommended, especially indoors and where physical distancing is not possible. However, it will no

longer be compulsory to wear a face mask at places of worship. Observe 1.5 metre social distancing at all times. There will be no restrictions on choirs and congregational singing at places of worship.

CONTACT TRACING:

Because NSW Government still requires contact tracing, we are implementing three ways to do this:

- Sign-in using the **QR Code** displayed near the entrance doors.
- Mass Attendance Slips MUST be completed by each household per mass. Slips are available in the foyer.
- Online booking via Calendly. To register, go to: https://mqofblacktown.org.au, registration will close midnoon of every Friday.

To maximise the use of our liturgical space, please observe the following:

- 1. Families and those living under one household sit together.
- 2. Proceed to end of row if vacant.
- 3. Leave 3 chairs empty between you and another household.
- The elderly, those with health conditions, flulike symptoms and low-immune system are still advised to stay at home. Catholics from Parramatta Diocese are still dispensed from their Sunday Mass obligation until further notice.
- You are required to sanitise your hands on arrival at the church and disinfect your chair after the Mass. Sanitizer and wipes are provided at the church fovers.

We sincerely thank you for understanding, and for playing your part in keeping our community safe.



(Commencing on the 22nd July 2021).


