Man, created in the image and likeness of God, reflects that dignity God has bestowed upon him at creation. We share in the holiness, the sanctity of God. We are the only creatures God has intended for himself to share in perfect happiness with him for ever. Yet, we know that with the first rebellion of man against God, sin entered the world and we are all affected by its consequence. God has to rescue us through his Son becoming like us, taking on flesh so that he can redeem us and give us back the sanctifying grace that was lost at the beginning. The drama of sin provides the plot in our stories of life, to what is sacred and what is not or what is profane. Sin has to be conquered for us by the One who took all sins to himself on the cross.

**Sacred or Profane?** 

The history of salvation in the Sacred Scriptures is very important in our understanding of Jesus' encounter with some of the Pharisees and Scribes who were meticulous in observing external ritual purifications but not attending the matter of the heart. There were foundational laws, especially the 10 commandments, that God has given to the Israelites to guide them in their way of living so that they can be sanctified and grow in their love for God and neighbour. There were also some ritual laws to help them reject the pagan idol worship. Along the way, some were so preoccupied with these rituals laws that they had exaggerated them and made their own human traditions that eventually as Jesus said to them, "You leave the commandment of God and hold on to the tradition of men."

The heart of the matter is not therefore what one sees outside. That is not what ultimately sanctify the person. Although of course, when one is already cleansed and purified by the grace of God inside, he would spontaneously reflect the goodness of God in his actions. So, Jesus challenges the Pharisees and the Scribes, and all of us to enter into our inner sanctuary and be honest to point out what has defiled us. He said, "What comes out of a person is what defiles him. For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, fornication, etc .... All these things come from within." Thus, with all honesty and humility we can turn to the mercy of God, to cleanse and sanctify us, and give us strength to follow his commandments, to do the will of God, so that we can reach our perfection in heaven and attain eternal happiness.

Alleluia, alleluia! The Father gave us birth by his message of truth, that we might be as the first fruits of his creation. Alleluia!

#### GOSPEL: Mk 7:1-8. 14-15. 21-23

The Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered round Jesus, and they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with unclean hands, that is, without washing them. For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the market place they never eat without first sprinkling themselves. There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes.

So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands? He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:

This people honours me only with lip-service, while their hearts are far from me. The worship they offer me is worthless, the doctrines they teach are only human regulations. You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.'

He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within and make a man unclean.'

## CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

PART ONE: THE PROFESSION OF FAITH SECTION TWO I. THE CREEDS CHAPTER TWO I BELIEVE IN JESUS CHRIST, THE ONLY SON OF GOD Article 4 "JESUS CHRIST SUFFERED UNDER PONTIUS PILATE, WAS CRUCIFIED, DIED AND WAS BURIED" Paragraph 1. JESUS AND ISRAEL

I. JEŠUS AND THE LAW

**580** The perfect fulfilment of the Law could be the work of none but the divine legislator, born subject to the Law in the person of the Son.<sup>337</sup> In Jesus, the Law no longer appears engraved on tables of stone but "upon the heart" of the Servant who becomes "a covenant to the people", because he will "faithfully bring forth justice".<sup>338</sup> Jesus fulfils the Law to the point of taking upon himself "the curse of the Law" incurred by those who do not "abide by the things written in the book of the Law, and do them", for his death took place to redeem them "from the transgressions under the first covenant".<sup>339</sup>

**581** The Jewish people and their spiritual leaders viewed Jesus as a rabbi.<sup>340</sup> He often argued within the framework of rabbinical interpretation of the Law.<sup>341</sup> Yet Jesus could not help but offend the teachers of the Law, for he was not content to propose his interpretation alongside theirs but taught the people "as one who had authority, and not as their scribes".<sup>342</sup> In Jesus, the same Word of God that had resounded on Mount Sinai to give the written Law to Moses, made itself heard anew on the Mount of the Beatitudes.<sup>343</sup> Jesus did not abolish the Law but fulfilled it by giving its ultimate interpretation in a divine way: "You have heard that it was said to the men of old. . . But I say to you. . "<sup>344</sup> With this same divine authority, he disavowed certain human traditions of the Pharisees that were "making void the word of God".<sup>345</sup>

**582** Going even further, Jesus perfects the dietary law, so important in Jewish daily life, by revealing its pedagogical meaning through a divine interpretation: "Whatever goes into a man from outside cannot defile him. . . (Thus he declared all foods clean.). . . What comes out of a man is what defiles a man. For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts. . . "<sup>346</sup> In presenting with divine authority the definitive interpretation of the Law, Jesus found himself confronted by certain teachers of the Law who did not accept his interpretation of the Law, guaranteed though it was by the divine signs that accompanied it.<sup>347</sup> This was the case especially with the sabbath laws, for he recalls, often with rabbinical arguments, that the sabbath rest is not violated by serving God and neighbour,<sup>348</sup> which his own healings did.


