Mary, Assumed into Heaven

15TH AUGUST 2021

"Blessed is she who trusted that the Lord's words to her would be fulfilled." Elizabeth, the Virgin Mary's cousin recognizes the greatness of her faith in God and the humble dispositions of her heart. Elizabeth proclaims that Mary is the mother of her Lord.

In this Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary, we have a glimpse of the mystery of God's work revealed in the life of our Blessed Mother who was assumed into heaven body and soul. Chosen by the Father to carry in her womb his Only-Begotten Son, Jesus Christ, she was preserved from the stains of sin. She is indeed full of grace. However, Mary in her freedom, chose to submit completely her whole life and be always faithful to God, followed her Son as a disciple, and so preserved herself from the corruption of sin. God's glory is truly revealed in her. She is the most "blest among all women."

Mary points to us our final destiny, the fullness of communion in heaven with the Holy Trinity and with those who persevere to the end accepting and doing the will of God. We can learn from the FIAT of the Blessed Mother, "Let your will be done to me according to your WORD." She sees herself as God's poor, God's "anawim." By doing so she found herself proclaiming the greatness of the Lord and her spirit rejoices in God's saving act. We know that in the Scriptures, the "anawim" catches the heart and eyes of God. He has a special love for them because they can only rely on Him, trusting in his providence. Let's not forget that this kind of poverty is not solely material, this is really first of all spiritual. Because of our sins, we are all poor in God's eyes and the grace of his mercy is always available for us.

When our hearts open up for God's mercy and we acknowledge our lowliness, we could rejoice in God's greatness. O Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of all, please pray for us! We entrust ourselves in your motherly care and protection, look at us with the eves of mercy and love and bring us closer to your Son Jesus so that one day we will enjoy the unending bliss with the Holy Trinity, with you and all the angels and saints in heaven!

THE LITURGY THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

ENTERANCE ANTIPHON: Cf. Rev 12:1 A great sign appeared in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun, and the moon beneath her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars.

FIRST READING: RV 11:19; 12:1-6, 10

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: PS 44:10-12. 16. R. V.10 (R.) The queen stands at your right hand, arrayed in gold.

SECOND READING: COL 3:12-17

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: 1 Cor 15:20-26

Alleluia, alleluia! Mary is taken up to heaven, and the angels of God shout for joy. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Lk 1:39-56

Mary set out and went as quickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'

And Mary said:

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord and my spirit exults in God my saviour; because he has looked upon his lowly handmaid. Yes, from this day forward all generations will call me blessed, for the Almighty has done great things for me.

Holy is his name, and his mercy reaches from age to age for those who fear him. He has shown the power of his arm, he has routed the proud of heart. He has pulled down princes from their thrones and exalted the lowly.

The hungry he has filled with good things, the rich sent empty away. He has come to the help of Israel his servant, mindful of his mercy – according to the promise he made to our ancestors – of his mercy to Abraham and to his descendants for ever.'

Mary stayed with Elizabeth about three months and then went back home.

CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

PART ONE: THE PROFESSION OF FAITH SECTION TWO I. THE CREEDS CHAPTER TWO I BELIEVE IN JESUS CHRIST, THE ONLY SON OF GOD Article 4 "JESUS CHRIST SUFFERED UNDER PONTIUS PILATE, WAS CRUCIFIED, DIED AND WAS BURIED" Paragraph 1. JESUS AND ISRAEL

574 From the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, certain Pharisees and partisans of Herod together with priests and scribes agreed together to destroy him.³¹⁷ Because of certain acts of his expelling demons, forgiving sins, healing on the sabbath day, his novel interpretation of the precepts of the Law regarding purity, and his familiarity with tax collectors and public sinners³¹⁸--some ill-intentioned persons suspected Jesus of demonic possession.³¹⁹ He is accused of blasphemy and false prophecy, religious crimes which the Law punished with death by stoning.³²⁰

575 Many of Jesus' deeds and words constituted a "sign of contradiction",³²¹ but more so for the religious authorities in Jerusalem, whom the Gospel according to John often calls simply "the Jews",³²² than for the ordinary People of God.³²³ To be sure, Christ's relations with the Pharisees were not exclusively polemical. Some Pharisees warn him of the danger he was courting;324 Jesus praises some of them, like the scribe of Mark 12:34, and dines several times at their homes.³²⁵ Jesus endorses some of the teachings imparted by this religious elite of God's people: the resurrection of the dead,³²⁶ certain forms of piety (almsgiving, fasting and prayer),³²⁷ The custom of addressing God as Father, and the centrality of the commandment to love God and neighbour.³²⁸

576 In the eyes of many in Israel, Jesus seems to be acting against essential institutions of the Chosen People: - submission to the whole of the Law in its written commandments and, for the Pharisees, in the interpretation of oral tradition; - the centrality of the Temple at Jerusalem as the holy place where God's presence dwells in a special way; - faith in the one God whose glory no man can share.

WELCOME FR. CHADI IBRAHIM, SDB.

On behalf of our Parish community we welcome our new assistant priest, Fr. Chadi Ibrahim, SDB.

Fr. Chadi was born in Aleppo, Syria in 1973. He grew up in a catholic family of five members. In his youth he was a member of the Legion of Mary where learned the love of the Mass, and how to pray the Rosary and to love the Virgin Mary. One of the most important people who

influenced his faith was his mother. After he finished his technical high school he worked for one year, after which he decide to enter the Salesian Congregation.

During his 10 years of formation he spent it in Egypt where having done his pre-novitiate, in Italy where he studied philosophy, and in the Holy Land where he studied theology. Fr.Chadi undertook missionary work with the Salesians in many counties, including Lebanon, Syria, Egypt, Iraq, Palestine and Italy. He is multilingual, fluent in Arabic, Italian and good English, French and Spanish. Fr.Chadi has also held a number of pastoral responsibilities, including director of an oratory and youth centre, bursar, rector and school principal. In all these roles he has felt that he has made a valuable contribution to the mission of the Church and the Order, with the help of God and the Hand of his mother our beloved Virgin Mary.
