# **Love Your Enemies**

Last Sunday we heard Jesus' Sermon on the Plain about the four beatitudes of happiness (blessedness) and the four curses (woes). In his teaching, Jesus describes our enemies as those who see us when we as poor, hungry, weeping, hated, driven out, abused, and denounced as criminals on his account. We are to love such people.

In Sunday's Liturgy, Jesus continues to present to us one of the most basic qualities that Christians should demonstrate if we are truly to be his disciples, we must love our enemies.

The message of the readings for this Sunday's Mass is all about something that we need to do for ourselves when we are annoved and mistreated. The Gospel's passage contains five commands of Jesus: love, forgive, do good, bless, and pray. Jesus' words are challenging to all humanity. These words are the way of life Jesus expects for his disciples. This is to distinguish the specific kind of love that the Christian followers have towards the enemy. The enemy is someone who injures, hates, or rejects the Christians, small or big - could be in the family, Church, community, society, or workplace. This is a difficult thing to do in our natural human life. But Jesus expects us to rise above our good human conscience and imitate the goodness and generosity of God. God has loved and shown mercy to His enemies, because He created us from His own image and likeness.

Jesus has shown us his love in his passion, forgiving his enemies as they made him carry his cross, stripped him of his cloak and tunic, curse him and struck him on the cheek, condemned him to death on the cross. Jesus forgives his enemies. He tells us that without love his mission would not go ahead to all people. Jesus asks us to follow his example and the example of the heavenly Father has given him.

Therefore, the message we need to take from the readings in this Sunday's Mass is that Jesus is teaching and challenging us to accept and endure unjust suffering for his sake and for the sake of his Gospel. We can ask these questions: Do I have anyone in my life I call an enemy? Is there anyone who hates, curses, mistreats me? Does their behaviour of controlling our feelings and thoughts hurt us? The cycle of hurt goes on and on. It becomes difficult to forgive. But Jesus is telling us only his cross will give us courage to return good for evil. Today, Jesus asks us to follow his way of prayer for the gift of the Holy Spirit to give us the strength to forgive. Amen.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Re: COVID-19 (Coronavirus) Update

The NSW Government has announced the following changes with regards to restrictions.

From Friday 18 February 2022, the following will apply:

#### 1. COVID-19 Safe Check-in and Record Keeping

Check-in using the NSW QR Code and record keeping for attendees is no longer required for places of worship.

#### 2. Singing

Both the choir and congregation are able to sing at religious services at our churches.

From Friday 25 February 2022:

#### 3. Masks

As of Friday, 25 February 2022, masks will no longer be mandatory for places of worship. However, masks are still strongly encouraged where you cannot maintain a safe distance from others.

As previously communicated, density limits were no longer applicable for our churches since December 2021. There is no change to this directive from the NSW government.




