Humility and Spiritual Insight

As a good teacher, Jesus often uses parables to evoke deep reflection and realization from his listeners. Parables are not just those stories of Jesus like the prodigal son, or the weeds and the wheat, etc. They also come in the form of riddles and questions. In this Sunday's gospel account (Luke 6:39-45), Jesus asks, "Can a blind man lead a blind man? Will they not fall into the pit?" "Why do you see the speck in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye?"

The kind of blindness that Jesus was referring to is not from natural sight or physical blindness but a spiritual one. He's talking about people who are blind to their own sinfulness, to their weaknesses and faults. Why is it important to come to our senses to this truth of our existence? We can see in the lives of the saints the depth of their own humility before God, not because they have bad self-esteem, rather their selfknowledge is greater than those who are full of themselves, their ego and pride. "They can clearly see the holiness of God and the greater the light of the holiness of God becomes, the more they become aware of their own sinfulness. They're not exaggerating. They're speaking the truth but from a vantage point that most of us can't see, because most of us are blind to our own sinfulness and our own faults. So, what Jesus' first thing out here is, everyone knows that if a blind person wants to reach a destination, he doesn't ask another blind person to lead him there because they'll both end up falling into a pit. The imagery here is that he's trying to call to mind (kind of make us aware of) the reality of our own spiritual blindness(Brant Pitre).

Likewise, Jesus teaches us to try first to take the log from our own eye, correcting ourselves of our faults, fighting against hypocrisy, not going around judging and condemning others. This is humility and true spiritual insight, the beginning of our spiritual journey, the journey of our salvation in Christ who comes to redeem and save us. This is also the path to grow in virtues which is needed if we would like to become fruitful in our spiritual lives. Jesus says, "No good tree bears bad fruit, nor again does a bad tree bear good fruit; for each tree is known by its own fruit."

May we all strive to grow in holiness.

CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Fast and Abstinence

On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday Catholics are obliged to fast and abstain (see below the Code of Canon Law, canons1250-1253). We are to turn away from sin and believe in the Gospel.

Abstinence means that no meat is eaten on those days for those who are age 14 and above. Everyone of age 18 to 59 must fast, unless exempt due to usually a medical reason. Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. In all cases, common sense should prevail, and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

To fast means eating one main meal and eating a smaller amount of food at other the times of the day. When fasting, snacking is not permitted. As a way of keeping the memory of the death of the Lord on Good Friday alive in our spiritual life, Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence; the Church also teaches that all Fridays are days of penance, and abstinence is the preferred form of penance.

Meat is the flesh and organs of mammals and fowl.

The Code of Canon Law says the following on the observance of fast and abstinence:

Canon 1250 All Fridays through the year and the time of Lent are penitential days and times throughout the entire Church.

Canon 1251 Abstinence from eating meat or another food according to the prescriptions of the conference of bishops is to be observed on Fridays throughout the year unless they are solemnities; abstinence and fast are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on the Friday of the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Canon 1252 All persons who have completed their fourteenth year are bound by the law of abstinence; all adults are bound by the law of fast up to the beginning of their sixtieth year. Nevertheless, pastors and parents are to see to it that minors who are not bound by the law of fast and abstinence are educated in an authentic sense of penance.

Canon 1253 It is for the conference of bishops to determine more precisely the observance of fast and abstinence and to substitute in whole or in part for fast and abstinence other forms of penance, especially works of charity and exercises of piety.



IMPORTANT COVID~19 ALERTS

The NSW Government has announced the following changes with regards to restrictions. From Friday, 25th of February 2022, the following will apply:

- COVID-19 SAFE CHECK-IN AND RECORD KEEPING Check-in using the NSW QR Code and record 1. keeping for attendees is **no longer required** for places of worship.
- 2. **SINGING** - Both the choir and congregation are able to sing at religious services at our churches.
- 3. MASKS - As of Friday, 25 February 2022, masks will no longer be mandatory for places of worship. HOWEVER, MASKS ARE STILL STRONGLY ENCOURAGED WHERE YOU CANNOT MAINTAIN A SAFE DISTANCE FROM OTHERS.
- 4. **SOCIAL DISTANCING** - As previously communicated, density limits were no longer applicable for our churches and other buildings within the Parish. HOWEVER OUR SAFETY PLAN STILL RECOMMENDS SOCIAL DISTANCING WHERE POSSIBLE.
- 5. NOT FEELING WELL - Please do not attend, stay home if you are unwell or have been in close contact with a COVID Positive person.

GET VACCINATED FOR THE COMMON GOOD

Vaccination against COVID-19 is a morally good thing, providing protection for the person vaccinated and the wider community. Some COVID-19 vaccines are associated with ethically questionable production and research practices, but Pope Francis and the Australian Bishops have advised that it is morally permissible to receive any vaccine made available. 




