TIME FOR REPENTANCE

Lent is a time for repentance. Jesus teaches us 'Unless you repent you will all perish as they did." The Gospel tells us about the concern of people who died at the hand of evil leaders. The killing of innocent people is happening now. Weapons of mass destruction are being used to kill human beings. We are seeing what is happening in Ukraine, Syria, Ethiopia, South Sudan, and other parts of the world. President Putin of Russia had prepared for years to invade Ukraine, no one was surprised. The powerful countries did little to stop him from killing innocent people.

We read in the first part of the Gospel some people were speaking to Jesus of the slaughter and atrocity carried out by Pilate's soldiers towards innocent Galileans who came to pray and offer sacrifices in the Temple. Difficult to understand, but a cruel sin. When Jesus heard of this, he was troubled, as he knew he would die in Jerusalem. But what did Jesus do? Jesus truly called out, named, and shamed the atrocity carried out by Pilate's soldiers in the name of authority and power. He calls for repentance of the sins committed. The Jewish religious leaders plotted to disgrace and dishonour him for what he preached and taught. His own people handed him to the Roman authority to be executed with worse and brutal atrocity. Jesus knew it was the will of the Father to sacrifice His only Son to die for our sake. He remained faithful and maintained his relationship with the Father.

Let us understand the atrocity that happened during Jesus' time is also happening in our time. The ordinary people of our time are caught up to suffer the consequences of bad government and self-serving leaders. They do not want to confess and repent. The question is, what can we do to make a difference? Let us pray and believe in the power of praver.

Jesus is telling us not to lose hope, hold on to our faith, and maintain our relationship with God who is powerful than evil. Jesus is asking all people to repent if our words, thoughts, and actions hurt our fellow human beings. Let us believe and trust God who is loving and merciful. Amen.




