Rejoicing in the mercy of God

The fourth Sunday of Lent is called Laetare Sunday. The Church invites us to rejoice in the middle of our Lenten observances in view of the great mystery of Easter, the ultimate victory of God over sin and death in the resurrection of our Lord Jesus. The parable of Jesus about the lost son who went back to his father after living a miserable life and of being separated from him (Luke 15:1-3, 11-32), gives us a vivid example that turning towards God who is not just waiting for us but also taking all the initiative to draw us to himself, is a cause of rejoicing. In the preceding two parables of Jesus (Luke 15:1-10- the lost sheep and the lost coin), he clearly emphasized that "there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine persons who need no repentance."

This parable of Jesus about the lost son, or the commonly called the prodigal son and the **bountiful mercy** of the father, likewise, gives us a picture of what sin brings to us: it separates us from God and others, it brings sufferings to our lives, and it also gives us a sense that we are unclean, that we are not worthy. But all these effects of sin can be reversed when we come to our senses (contrite) and realized how merciful God is, and in repenting or turning towards him (especially in the sacrament of confession/ reconciliation) we are received back into the arms of God who is always ready to forgive and bestows the grace of healing, peace, and reconciliation.

The story of God's people in the Sacred Scriptures, including us in our times, reflects this powerful parable of Jesus in the metaphor of being dead and alive (death and resurrection), of being lost and found (exile and return). "It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found" (Luke 15:32). The Israelites understood that being exiled is connected to their experience of sin and rebellion against God. We too, can be spiritually exiled in our persistence to turn away from God. But like the prodigal/lost son, we can turn towards him and begin anew, living in the life of the Spirit (spiritual resurrection: CCC 1468) May this Lent be for us a grace to experience more fully the mercy of God.




