The theme of darkness and light is an important one in the gospel of John. Darkness is associated with evil, with sin and death. In contrast, Jesus is the light which shines in the darkness and which the darkness did not overcome. Because he is the light, and because, in his rising from the dead, darkness holds no power over him, he is ultimately trustworthy. He is a sure guide who will not fail us if only we would listen to his voice and follow him, even in the most ordinary everyday circumstances.

In this Sunday's gospel, Peter and his companions spent all night at a task which they had once based their livelihood on, but only was it with the appearance of Jesus in the light of day and at his guidance that they were able to achieve what they set out to do. Without the sure guidance of Jesus, even in those tasks which are so familiar to us and over which we think we have control, all our efforts will amount to nothing. Indeed we are only to live with the freedom and confidence which we see Peter and the apostles eventually living in Acts, because the Risen Jesus has given us to do so. He loves us and wants only our good, but if we insist on doing things our own way we will always end up with an empty net.

This is extremely challenging, and we will fail at times. But as with Peter, Jesus offers us the chance to begin again and to cover over our failures with much love. We might not be able yet to fully surrender like the martyrs did, but we have to begin somewhere just like Peter. He was only able to begin though, because the one who was asking for his obedience had gone before him into death and rose again, offering Peter once more his love. Peter realised, as the Book of Revelation tells us, that only the Lamb who was slain is owed power and glory and honour. Only Jesus is worthy of our obedience, because only he went into death and conquered it; he alone faced the suffering and death that our sins have caused and did away with it. Indeed, Jesus is the light which shines in the darkness and which the darkness did not overcome. So let us renew our trust in him, our sure guide.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Alleluia, alleluia! Christ is risen, the Lord of all creation; he has shown pity on all people. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: Jn 21:1-19

Jesus showed himself again to the disciples. It was by the Sea of Tiberias, and it happened like this: Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night.

It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' And when they answered, 'No', he said, 'Throw the net out to starboard and you'll find something.' So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord.' At these words 'It is the Lord,' Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land.

As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught.' Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken. Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples was bold enough to ask, 'Who are you?'; they knew quite well it was the Lord. Jesus then stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish. This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after rising from the dead.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: Lk 24:35

The disciples recognized the Lord Jesus in the breaking of the bread, alleluia.

CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

PART TWO: THE CELEBRATION OF THE CHRISTIAN MYSTERY SECTION TWO THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH CHAPTER TWO THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Article 5

The many forms of penance in Christian life

1438 The seasons and days of penance in the course of the liturgical year (Lent, and each Friday in memory of the death of the Lord) are intense moments of the Church's penitential practice. These times are particularly appropriate for spiritual exercises, penitential liturgies, pilgrimages as signs of penance, voluntary self-denial such as fasting and almsgiving, and fraternal sharing (charitable and missionary works).

1439 The process of conversion and repentance was described by Jesus in the parable of the prodigal son, the center of which is the merciful father:³⁷ The fascination of illusory freedom, the abandonment of the father's house; the extreme misery in which the son finds himself after squandering his fortune; his deep humiliation at finding himself obliged to feed swine, and still worse, at wanting to feed on the husks the pigs ate; his reflection on all he has lost; his repentance and decision to declare himself guilty before his father; the journey back; the father's generous welcome; the father's joy - all these are characteristic of the process of conversion. the beautiful robe, the ring, and the festive banquet are symbols of that new life - pure worthy, and joyful - of anyone who returns to God and to the bosom of his family, which is the Church. Only the heart of Christ Who knows the depths of his Father's love could reveal to us the abyss of his mercy in so simple and beautiful a way.

PRAYER FOR PEACE & JUSTICE IN UKRAINE

God of peace and justice, who change the hardened heart and break the power of violence, we entrust the people of Ukraine to you. Protect them in this time of mortal peril; let them know not death but life, not slavery but freedom.

COVID-19 UPDATE

MASKS - will no longer be mandatory. However, masks are still strongly encouraged where you cannot maintain a safe distance from others.

The seven-day isolation requirement remains in place for anyone who has recorded a positive RAT or PCR result

Self-isolation rules - From 6pm on Friday, 22 April 2022, the following will apply:

- Close contacts (defined as a household contact or an individual deemed by NSW Health to be a close contact)
 will not have to isolate, as long as they have no symptoms and comply with the following guidelines they:
- Do not visit aged care, hospitals, disability, and correctional facilities unless a special exemption applies;
- Wear a face mask in indoor settings outside the home;
- Undertake daily RAT tests before coming into close contact with people outside their household, where practicable;
- Avoid contact with elderly and immunocompromised persons where possible; Work from home where practical; and Notify their employer/ educational facility that they are a close contact, and that they are not required to isolate as long as they comply with the above.
- Close contacts will need to comply with the above guidelines for 7 days from the time a person in their household tested positive for COVID-19.

We sincerely thank you for understanding, and for playing your part in keeping our community safe.



RCIA PROCESS

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process in which adults become full, participating members of the Catholic Church. Participants, known as catechumens go through a process of studying the Gospel, nurturing their relationship with God, becoming familiar with the Catholic teachings and practices, professing their faith in Jesus and the Church, and receiving the sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation. If you know anyone who would like to go through the process, contact the parish office.

ADULT CONFIRMATIONS 2022

The Office for Worship will host a Catechesis and Formation Day for those candidates interested in receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this year. This will be on Saturday 20th August, 9.30am - 2.00pm at the Bede Heather Centre (formerly known as the Institute For Mission) in the Downstairs Hall, 1-5 Marion Street, Blacktown 2148 (off Flushcombe Road).

A light lunch will be provided on the day. It is recommended that all sponsors attend the catechesis. A contribution of \$25 is suggested from the candidates to assist in the overall task of preparing the candidates for the sacrament. They may bring this on the Catechesis Day.

The directive concerning Confirmation names is as follows:

Please register your interest by Friday 29th July 2022.

"Confirmation names should be those of recognised saints. If the given name of the candidate is a saint's name, there is no need to choose another. Ho ever, if the given name is not a saint's name, then a saint's name should be chosen."

Each candidate must have a sponsor who is fully initiated in the Sacraments, is over sixteen years of age and is aware of the responsibility needed for this role. For more information please contact Ged our sacramental coordinator. Date of confirmation will be Thursday 1st September, 2022 at 7.30pm.






