Loving God and keeping his commandments

"Whoever loves me will keep my word." Love is at the heart of the covenant God has established with the people he chose for himself to perpetuate it to the whole of humanity. A covenant requires fidelity to the promises made by the two parties, done freely and out of love. The pinnacle of freedom is seen in the most selfless act of the person towards God and one's neighbour. "I will be your God, and you will be my people." This promise of God run throughout the fabric of the Sacred Scripture. Christ has fulfilled it on the cross. He has inaugurated the new covenant during the Last Supper and renewed again and again when we celebrate the Holy Eucharist. "This is my body... this is the chalice of my blood, the blood of the new and eternal covenant" (Eucharistic Prayer I-IV). "Do this in memory of me."

The commandments of God are expressions of his love that would lead us to the fulness of life. The temptation of the ancient serpent to Adam and Eve was to put in their minds doubt on God's love for them and that he's arbitrary by not allowing them to eat the fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil. While they are already like god bearing his image and likeness, they gave in to the temptation to be like God without God (CCC 398). That's the greatest tragedy that has entered humanity. The rest of the story is a bit long to be told. God does not give up, however. His love is everlasting.

The Catholic Church, our mother who teaches us, echoes this invitation throughout the generations. "God has loved us first. The love of the One God is recalled in the first of the 'ten words'. The commandments then make explicit the response of love that man is called to give God" (CCC 2083). We all certainly know our predicament. We are all wounded, and we carry this even after our baptism. St Augustine calls this concupiscence, our tendency to sin. This is the reason God has to redeem us and save us from being eternally separated from him. He sent his only-begotten Son, the Second Person of the Trinity, a God-incarnate, taking on our flesh, he became like us except sin. Jesus willingly embrace the mission entrusted to him by the Father so that through his life, death and resurrection, we will all be led back to our eternal home- the life of the Trinity. When he ascended into heaven, he did not leave us orphans. He sends us another helper, a Paraclete, an advocate- the Holy Spirit. The presence of the Holy Spirit has penetrated every sacrament that we have in the Catholic Church. He will help us to obey God's commandments and to love God, for He is the Spirit of Love of the Father and the Son. He is the fire of love that would enflame our hearts to hold on to the covenant God has made between us in Jesus Christ. Dear brothers and sister, let not our failures, our sins stop us to approach the throne of God's mercy and faithfulness.

Let's continue our covenant journey by loving God and keeping his commandments.

The sacrament of penance and reconciliation

1446 Christ instituted the sacrament of Penance for all sinful members of his Church: above all for those who, since Baptism, have fallen into grave sin, and have thus lost their baptismal grace and wounded ecclesial communion. It is to them that the sacrament of Penance offers a new possibility to convert and to recover the grace of justification. The Fathers of the Church present this sacrament as "the second plank [of salvation] after the shipwreck which is the loss of grace."47



COVID-19 UPDATE

MASKS - will no longer be mandatory. However, masks are still strongly encouraged where you cannot maintain a safe distance from others.

The seven-day isolation requirement remains in place for anyone who has recorded a positive RAT or PCR result

Self-isolation rules - From 6pm on Friday, 22 April 2022, the following will apply:

Close contacts (defined as a household contact or an individual deemed by NSW Health to be a close contact) will not have to isolate, as long as they have no symptoms and comply with the following guidelines they :

- Do not visit aged care, hospitals, disability, and correctional facilities unless a special exemption applies;
- Wear a face mask in indoor settings outside the home;
- Undertake daily RAT tests before coming into close contact with people outside their household, where practicable;
 - Avoid contact with elderly and immunocompromised persons where possible; Work from home where practical; and Notify their employer/ educational facility that they are a close contact, and that they are not required to isolate as long as they comply with the above.
 - Close contacts will need to comply with the above guidelines for 7 days from the time a person in their household tested positive for COVID-19.

We sincerely thank you for understanding, and for playing your part in keeping our community safe.

RCIA PROCESS

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process in which adults become full, participating members of the Catholic Church. Participants, known as catechumens go through a process of studying the Gospel, nurturing their relationship with God, becoming familiar with the Catholic teachings and practices, professing their faith in Jesus and the Church, and receiving the sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Communion, and Confirmation. If you know anyone who would like to go through the process, contact the parish office.

ADULT CONFIRMATIONS 2022

The Office for Worship will host a Catechesis and Formation Day for those candidates interested in receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this year. This will be on **Saturday 20th August, 9.30am – 2.00pm** at the Bede Heather Centre (formerly known as the Institute For Mission) in the Downstairs Hall, 1- 5 Marion Street, Blacktown 2148 (off Flushcombe Road).

A light lunch will be provided on the day. It is recommended that all sponsors attend the catechesis. A contribution of \$25 is suggested from the candidates to assist in the overall task of preparing the candidates for the sacrament. They may bring this on the Catechesis Day.

The directive concerning Confirmation names is as follows:

"Confirmation names should be those of recognised saints. If the given name of the candidate is a saint's name, there is no need to choose another. Ho ever, if the given name is not a saint's name, then a saint's name should be chosen."

Each candidate must have a sponsor who is fully initiated in the Sacraments, is over sixteen years of age and is aware of the responsibility needed for this role. For more information please contact Ged our sacramental coordinator. Date of confirmation will be Thursday 1st September, 2022 at 7.30pm. Please register your interest by Friday 29th July 2022.


