Before Jesus was taken into heaven, he tells the disciples that it is not for them to know times or seasons, yet after he disappears from their sight, they stand there gazing into the heavens. Maybe they were dumfounded by what they had just seen, or maybe they were expecting his immediate return. Whatever the case, they are reminded by the angels of the command of the Lord and to get on with the work he intrusted to them.

Why are you gazing into heaven? It is a perennial temptation that we want to know what's going to happen. This is often the case in our own lives when we try to control outcomes or seek from the Lord assurances about this or that. This is deeply rooted in our fallen nature, stemming from the original temptation to grasp at knowledge not given to us by the Lord. In a similar way that we see the disciples grasping after what is not for them to know, there are often movements within the Church which claim to know exactly that, predicting times and seasons. Beware of these. Christ is the definitive Revelation of the Father and so, in a way, there is nothing more to be said. We are given everything we need to know in him and about those things which are to come we must in humility leave that for the Lord.

After he ascended, the angels remind them of Jesus' instructions, to go and bear witness to him throughout the world, and to baptise in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, with the assurance that he will come again. Our task between the advents of the Lord is to make him known. We know that Jesus will come again and restore us in the resurrection, but until then he expects from us his followers to witness to his saving power by our words and deeds, not to worry about when or how things will turn out.

But we can only do this by the power of his Holy Spirit. At Pentecost which we celebrate next week, we are reminded of the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles which set them ablaze to go and fulfil this very task. Let us pray then for his coming upon us so tha<mark>t w</mark>e ma<mark>y r</mark>emain faithful to the mission entrusted to us by the Lord and be ever more fully conformed to him who will come again.

CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

PART TWO: THE CELEBRATION OF THE CHRISTIAN MYSTERY SECTION TWO THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH CHAPTER TWO THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Article 6

The sacrament of penance and reconciliation

1447 Over the centuries the concrete form in which the Church has exercised this power received from the Lord has varied considerably. During the first centuries the reconciliation of Christians who had committed particularly grave sins after their Baptism (for example, idolatry, murder, or adultery) was tied to a very rigorous discipline, according to which penitents had to do public penance for their sins, often for years, before receiving reconciliation. To this "order of penitents" (which concerned only certain grave sins), one was only rarely admitted and in certain regions only once in a lifetime. During the seventh century Irish missionaries, inspired by the Eastern monastic tradition, took to continental Europe the "private" practice of penance, which does not require public and prolonged completion of penitential works before reconciliation with the Church. From that time on, the sacrament has been performed in secret between penitent and priest. This new practice envisioned the possibility of repetition and so opened the way to a regular frequenting of this sacrament. It allowed the forgiveness of grave sins and venial sins to be integrated into one sacramental celebration. In its main lines this is the form of penance that the Church has practiced down to our day.



RCIA PROCESS

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is the process in which adults become full, participating members of the Catholic Church. Participants, known as catechumens go through a process of studying the Gospel, nurturing their relationship with God, becoming familiar with the Catholic teachings and practices, professing their faith in Jesus and the Church, and of initiation: the sacraments Baptism, Communion, receiving and Confirmation. If you know anyone who would like to go through the process, and know Jesus Christ more, please contact the parish office on 9622 1125.

ADULT CONFIRMATIONS 2022

The Office for Worship will host a Catechesis and Formation Day for those candidates interested in receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this year. This will be on Saturday 20th August, 9.30am - 2.00pm at the Bede Heather Centre (formerly known as the Institute For Mission) in the Downstairs Hall, 1-5 Marion Street, Blacktown 2148 (off Flushcombe Road).

A light lunch will be provided on the day. It is recommended that all sponsors attend the catechesis. A contribution of \$25 is suggested from the candidates to assist in the overall task of preparing the candidates for the sacrament. They may bring this on the Catechesis Day.

The directive concerning Confirmation names is as follows:

"Confirmation names should be those of recognised saints. If the given name of the candidate is a saint's name, there is no need to choose another. Ho ever, if the given name is not a saint's name, then a saint's name should be chosen."

Each candidate must have a sponsor who is fully initiated in the Sacraments, is over sixteen years of age and is aware of the responsibility needed for this role. For more information please contact Ged our sacramental coordinator. Date of confirmation will be Thursday 1st September, 2022 at 7.30pm. Please register your interest by Friday 29th July 2022.

The children return to Mass before the Eucharist celebration begins.


At what mass is Children's Lituray available?


