The Voice

"Voices" are competing with each other. We hear them from different sources and with the global networking we certainly get countless of them wanting to be heard. Unknowingly we can become followers of different kinds of ideologies or philosophies, or way of life and thinking. Put in a powerful imagery of the Shepherd and the sheep, Jesus alludes, "The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice; I know them and they follow me." He is worth listening to and following because he is the one sent by the Father to bring us back to God, to show us the heart of God who does not desire our damnation but freely calls us to himself, to receive his grace and mercy.

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday. The claim of Jesus as the Good Shepherd goes back to the Old Testament times where God himself appears as the Shepherd of Israel. This image of God brought so much hope and consolation to a people who were brought into exile, and also who have been deceived by self-seeking shepherds on those days. The prophet Ezekiel for example proclaims the promise that God himself will seek out his sheep and care for them (Ezekiel 34:13-16). A trustful response to this promise is expressed in this beautiful devotion of Psalm 23: "The Lord is my shepherd... Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil; for thou art with me" (Psalm 23:1-4).

We are certainly assured of the care and love of the Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep (John 10:11). Jesus as the real Shepherd came to give us life, and to have it abundantly (John 10:10). Jesus does not give us something, he gives us himself. Isn't his voice worth listening because he lived by example? This Vocation Sunday, when we especially pray for vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life, let us also ask the Lord that those who consecrated themselves for the service of God and his Church will constantly seek to listen and discern the voice and the will of God. Let us pray that as they follow Jesus, they may become shepherds according to his heart. May they never tire of listening to God in the Scriptures, through the teachings of the Church and the rich Tradition handed down to us.

It's also Mother's Day this Sunday. Mothers have a special vocation to guide and lead their children, to be good examples by their virtues. The Blessed Mother is worth emulating with her "YES" to God. May God's abundant blessings be upon all mothers. Happy Mother's Day!

CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

PART TWO: THE CELEBRATION OF THE CHRISTIAN MYSTERY SECTION TWO THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS OF THE CHURCH CHAPTER TWO THE SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Article 6

The sacrament of penance and reconciliation

1440 Sin is before all else an offense against God, a rupture of communion with him. At the same time it damages communion with the Church. For this reason conversion entails both God's forgiveness and reconciliation with the Church, which are expressed and accomplished liturgically by the sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.³⁸

1441 Only God forgives sins.³⁹ Since he is the Son of God, Jesus says of himself, "The Son of man has authority on earth to forgive sins" and exercises this divine power: "Your sins are forgiven."⁴⁰ Further, by virtue of his divine authority he gives this power to men to exercise in his name.⁴¹

1442 Christ has willed that in her prayer and life and action his whole Church should be the sign and instrument of the forgiveness and reconciliation that he acquired for us at the price of his blood. But he entrusted the exercise of the power of absolution to the apostolic ministry which he charged with the "ministry of reconciliation." COVID-19 UPDATE

MASKS - will no longer be mandatory. However, masks are still strongly encouraged where you cannot maintain a safe distance from others.

The seven-day isolation requirement remains in place for anyone who has recorded a positive RAT or PCR result

Self-isolation rules - From 6pm on Friday, 22 April 2022, the following will apply:

- Close contacts (defined as a household contact or an individual deemed by NSW Health to be a close contact)
 will not have to isolate, as long as they have no symptoms and comply with the following guidelines they:
- Do not visit aged care, hospitals, disability, and correctional facilities unless a special exemption applies;
- Wear a face mask in indoor settings outside the home;
- Undertake daily RAT tests before coming into close contact with people outside their household, where practicable;
- Avoid contact with elderly and immunocompromised persons where possible; Work from home where
 practical; and Notify their employer/ educational facility that they are a close contact, and that they are not
 required to isolate as long as they comply with the above.
- Close contacts will need to comply with the above guidelines for 7 days from the time a person in their household tested positive for COVID-19.

We sincerely thank you for understanding, and for playing your part in keeping our community safe.

ADULT CONFIRMATIONS 2022

The Office for Worship will host a Catechesis and Formation Day for those candidates interested in receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this year. This will be on Saturday 20th August, 9.30am - 2.00pm at the Bede Heather Centre (formerly known as the Institute For Mission) in the Downstairs Hall, 1-5 Marion Street, Blacktown 2148 (off Flushcombe Road).

A light lunch will be provided on the day. It is recommended that all sponsors attend the catechesis. A contribution of \$25 is suggested from the candidates to assist in the overall task of preparing the candidates for the sacrament. They may bring this on the Catechesis Day.

The directive concerning Confirmation names is as follows:

Please register your interest by Friday 29th July 2022.

"Confirmation names should be those of recognised saints. If the given name of the candidate is a saint's name, there is no need to choose another. Ho ever, if the given name is not a saint's name, then a saint's name should be chosen."

Each candidate must have a sponsor who is fully initiated in the Sacraments, is over sixteen years of age and is aware of the responsibility needed for this role.
